Membership

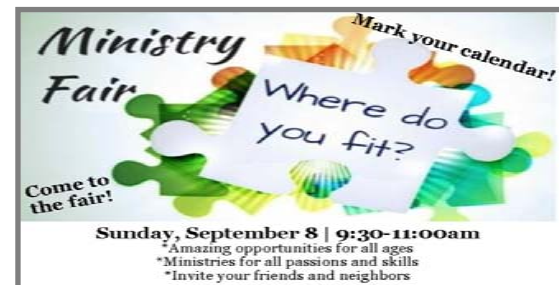
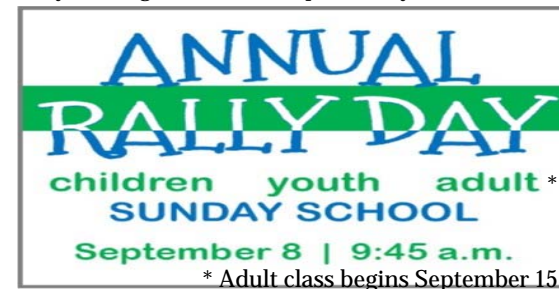
Looking for a church home?

Outreach Focus for September *Quilting Ministry*
