The CARES Act Deduction

The CARES Act, enacted by Congress, includes a special \$300 deduction designed especially for people who choose to take the standard deduction, rather than itemizing.

Many people may not realize it, but there is a special tax deduction available for them through Dec. 31, 2020 for cash donations up to \$300 to qualifying charities. The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act, enacted by Congress last spring, includes several temporary tax changes helping charities. This includes a special \$300 deduction designed especially for people who choose to take the standard deduction, rather than itemizing their deductions.

So if someone makes a cash donation to a qualifying charity such as St. John's Lutheran before the end of 2020, they can get a deduction of up to \$300. This will be easy to report when they fill out their Form 1040 in 2021, especially if they file electronically.

The deduction lowers both adjusted gross income and taxable income – translating into tax savings for those making donations to qualifying tax-exempt organizations.

Music Notes

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace and joy to you. Never in my ministry did I dream of a fall like 2020. We have all experienced anxiety, anger and a sense of loss. But we have also experienced joy, acts of kindness and new ways to spread the Word of God. A heartfelt thank you to the staff, musicians and congregation. We will continue to offer meaningful virtual worship services until we can gather together safely.

A small group of carolers were able to spread socially distanced cheer in December. Unfortunately, we were not allowed to visit any facilities but were able to visit a few homes.

ORGAN PROJECT UPDATE:

We are moving in phase two of the project. On January 5 Berghaus pipe organ builders will remove all existing pipework from the church. It will be transported to the shop where all the pipes will be cleaned. Organ pipes are made out of metal or wood and have different names depending on how the pipe is constructed.

All flue pipes will be submersed in a chemical solution, rinsed and hand polished.

All wooden pipes will be cleaned with appropriate cleaning solution.

Stoppers will be stripped of deteriorating leather and re-fit with new gasketing material.

They will repair cracks in wood pipes as necessary and disassemble each reed pipe, clean resonator and boot in chemical solution, and burnish shallot and tongue.

A message from Pastor Brian about youth ministry

As you know Carrie Allbaugh has discerned that God is calling her to explore new ways in which she can serve and grow. Carrie has done a wonderful job at not only beginning new programs and developing relationships with our high school and young adults; she continues to be inspirational and faithful in these relationships that have grown in her tenure here.

Earlier this week, a newly formed Children, Youth, and Family (CYF) Board met for the first time. This board is comprised of persons who care deeply about our high school and young adults in our congregation and who are passionate about the opportunities to explore and grow in faith. I want to thank Linnea Logan, who has agreed to be our Children, Youth, and Family Board chair, for stepping up to serve at this important time.

The Church will continue to provide:

- Confirmation classes for the 7th and 8th graders. Joanna and Pastor Brian will work together to teach.
- On an interim basis, Stephanie Broussard will assist me in the coordination of classes for the 9th graders. We will have two classes per month on Sunday afternoons. In addition we plan to offer the 9th graders the opportunities to connect with other members of the congregation in a mentoring program to form relationships that will continue beyond their confirmation years.
- Our high school gatherings on Sunday mornings will continue; however, Stephanie and I will begin planning for more opportunities to meet outdoors and organizing service projects that can bring us together in the work of the church and our community. Directly after the first of the year, we will be sending out surveys and talking to our high school youth to develop these plans more specifically.
- In the near future, Stephanie Broussard will be contacting our young adults to connect and invite their input on how we can engage and discuss important topics and matters of faith while gathering for service work that puts our faith into action.

At this time, I will lead the high school and young adult ministries. Stephanie Broussard, our ministry coordinator will assist me in organization and communications. We plan on hiring a person who, in this interim time, will also assist in organization and communication in our youth programming. Our intent, in this time of transition, is to give us time to give thoughtful consideration of how we want our CYF ministries to be organized, planned, and provided – and the type of staffing needs we have in order to grow and strengthen our high school and young adult ministries.

As we are providing these opportunities for education and faith formation, we are open to finding ways on which we can build our programs. I will collaborate with staff and the CYF Board to provide the educational and spiritual formation opportunities for our young people.

We welcome your thoughts and ideas as we continue to build a strong faith foundation for our high school and young adults in our congregation.

President Report

- The 2020 Stewardship of All Season (SAS) goal of \$110,000 was fully funded with the approval of the remaining \$16,330. A report highlighting all the ministries touched by your gracious giving will be shared in the near future.
- Council reviewed a preliminary proposed 2021 budget.
- The Congregational meeting will be held virtual via Zoom (you may also use a phone to call in and participate/attend and vote) on Sunday, January 31.
- Two listening sessions will be held via Zoom (you may also use a phone to call in and participate/attend) to preview and discuss the 2021 budget. Those dates will be Monday, January 4 at 4:00 p.m. and Wednesday, January 6 at 6:30 p.m.

- GROTH Design Group and the Master Planning committee met on December 3 to continue discussions on potential opportunities throughout the building.
- Council was challenged to discern St. John's vision and short and long-term goals in the upcoming years. These discussions will begin in January.

Financial Report

- St. John's overall financials remain in good shape. Thank you, as we continue to be blessed with your faithful giving.
- Council approved the financial team's recommendation of \$16,330 be transferred to the Stewardship for All Season (SAS) initiatives.
- Thank you to those who have turned in your 2021 pledge card.

Transition Team

- The team met December 8 to discuss and review local health data and CDC updated guidelines
- While local COVID case numbers are trending positively, the team agreed to continue suspension of in-person and other nonessential gatherings.

January was named for the Roman god Janus, known as the protector of gates and doorways, which symbolize beginnings and ends. Janus is depicted with two faces, one looking into the past, the other into the future—a fitting symbol for this first day of the year. It's natural for us to reflect on the past year and also look forward to the new.

The weather of the first 12 days of the year is said to be indicative of the following 12 months.

January 1 is [New Year's Day](#).

January 5 brings [Twelfth Night](#), an English folk custom that marked the end of Christmas merrymaking, and in ancient Celtic tradition, the end of the 12-day [winter solstice](#) celebration. On Twelfth Night, it was customary for the assembled company to toast each other from the [wassail bowl](#).

January 6 is [Epiphany](#). According to the New Testament's Gospels, on this date the Magi—the three wise men or kings—venerated and brought gifts to the infant Jesus. Bake a [King Cake](#) with a lucky bean inside!

January 18 is [Martin Luther King Jr. Day](#) (observed). This holiday is held on the third Monday in January and honors the principles of this civil rights leader and Nobel Prize Winner dedicated to nonviolence.

January 20 is [Inauguration Day](#), which is the day that the next U.S. president is sworn into office.

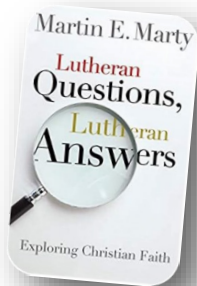

What Exactly Are Post-Holiday Blues?

This slump can hit hard after a period of intense emotion and stress. Post-holiday blues can show in many ways: insomnia, low-energy, irritability, difficulty concentrating, and anxiousness. But unlike clinical depression, the distress is short-lived rather than long-term. Though much greater attention is often given to depression that occurs during the holidays, the condition isn't all that uncommon.

What Causes the Blues?

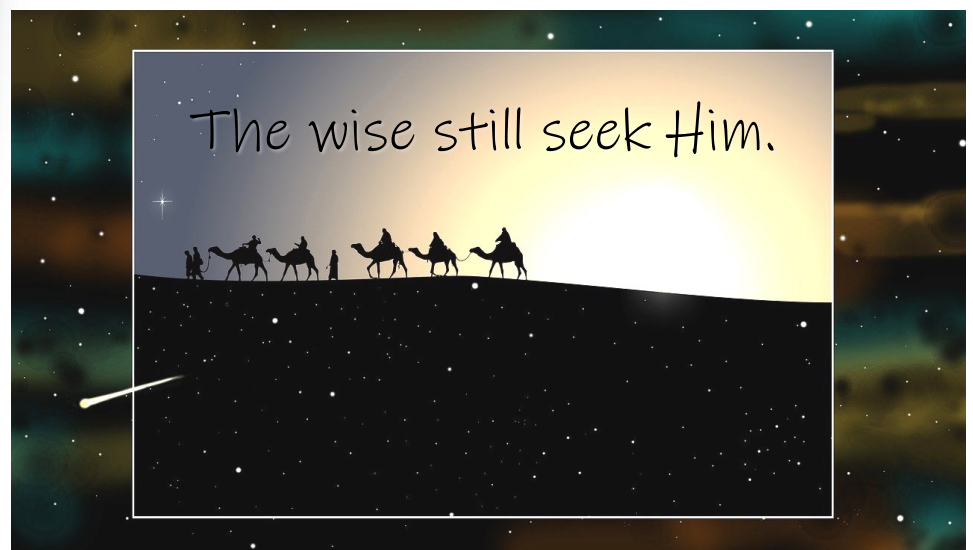
Consensus among experts is that the adrenaline comedown is the main culprit. Princeton, NJ-based clinical psychologist Dr. Eileen Kennedy-Moore suggests that the abrupt withdrawal of stress hormones after a major event, be it a wedding, an important deadline, or the holidays, can have a profound impact on our biological and psychological well-being.

Why Do We Feel It?

The holidays interrupt our regular lives. Even if the holidays weren't so merry and bright, or looked a little different than normal this year, the brain exaggerates the realities of day-to-day life, making the return to the mundane seem disproportionately more anxiety-inducing and depressing than it actually is.

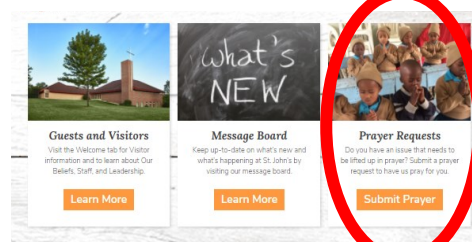

Accessing the St. John's YouTube Channel

"You can watch it on YouTube."

Do you want to watch St. John's amazing videos but are unsure how to access them? Keep reading. This article may help answer your questions, making YouTube your friend.

What is YouTube?

YouTube is a free video sharing service where users can watch, like, share, comment and upload their own videos. The video service can be accessed on PCs, laptops, tablets and via mobile phones. If you have access to the internet, you have access to YouTube.

How do I get YouTube on my phone?

Watch YouTube on your smartphone or tablet with the YouTube app. You can download the YouTube app on Google Play. Visit the Google Play Help Center to learn about managing Android app downloads from Google Play. Note: The app will only work on phones or tablets running Android version 4.0 and above.

How do I access YouTube on my computer?

Type youtube.com into your browser.

How do I find St. John's videos?

Type St Johns Lutheran Church Brookfield into the search bar on the top of the screen. There are many St. John's Lutheran churches. Look for the one with the blue "S" logo. Click that to go to our St. John's channel.

Is there an easier way?

Yes! In fact, there are a few ways to make it easier to find St. John's videos on YouTube.

1. Click the red "Subscribe" button. As a subscriber (it's free), you will be notified when new videos are added. We currently have 147 subscribers!
2. Bookmark the page as a favorite in your search engine.
3. Go directly to our channel via our website, makedisciples.com.

How do I go through the website?

1. Go to makedisciples.com.
2. OPTION 1: Without clicking, hover your mouse over the "Worship" tab. A submenu will appear. Click on "Worship Online" in the submenu.

OPTION 2: Click on "Now Offering Virtual Services. [Click Here](#)". This will go to the Worship Online page.

OPTION 3: Click on the blue "Worship Now" button. For now, this button also goes directly to the Worship Online page.

3. When the Worship Online page opens, you may click the blue "YouTube Channel" button to go directly to the St. John's channel. If you are wanting the most recent worship video, it is on the page and should begin playing automatically.

YouTube stores all of our videos on our channel. You may access them at any time.
