### **Pastor Ponders**

My daughter Eliza is moving to Chicago. Having spent the last six years in Minnesota, she is moving back to her home city. She has a sentimental attachment to Chicago, and I can understand why. During her senior year in high school Cindy took a position in Milwaukee and was gone for the week, returning back to Oak Park on the weekends. My elder daughter Madeleine was away at school in lowa. So it was just Eliza and me who stayed until she graduated from high school. That year, she and I went to many Blackhawk hockey games in the year in which they won the championship, but it didn't quite make up for a disrupted home life. She went on to attend the University of Minnesota (an excellent choice!) where she established many good friendships and lived many great experiences.

Now she is going home.

Home is a powerful place for many of us, perhaps because it is a place in our lives where we might have felt the most secure, a place where we are loved and supported. Perhaps it is a place where we feel we can be ourselves and let down our guard, so to speak. It is a place where we feel connected to our family, friends, and community. We are loved and valued as a part of something greater than ourselves. At least that is the ideal. Oftentimes, we sentimentalize home and often overlook or forget in our memories, the challenges and difficulties that homes can sometime bring.

For many, home does not draw the same feelings of security, love, and connection as it does for others. We hear of so many children who come from broken homes, where love, support and care are absent, where addictions bring about anger, deep uncertainty, and even violence. Yet I have known persons who come from broken homes to be strong, caring, and faithful people who in themselves begin to establish a home where love flourishes.

Often we refer to our church as a church home, and we ask visitors if they have found a church home yet. We extend the invitation for them to join us, where we offer love and support for anyone who comes through our doors or who we meet in our ministries. We offer a place in which everyone is loved and valued, not because we want more successful people in our pews to further the life of our church; instead we love and value each other because we are loved and valued by God.

As Pastor Frank said in a sermon, we are all beloved. And no matter where we go, there we are. We are beloved people of God who live in the home of God—cherished, nurtured, and made whole at the broken places.

Yes, we often hear that life is a journey. Perhaps it is a journey homeward, to a place where we are already reside. Our home is God. Welcome home!

June brings the opportunity to help our youth serve others during the High School Mission Trip. The trip this summer is to Milwaukee. They are gathering the following items to share during the mission trip.

- New clothing items & ways to carry them: white tube socks, new plain white t-shirts, flip flops, backpacks
- Toiletries: soap, shampoo, hand sanitizer, deodorant
- Cleaning: paper towels, tissue packs, toilet paper, unopened cleaning supplies, rubber gloves, laundry detergent
- Fun Things: arts and craft supplies, small safe toys, playing cards
- Batteries
- Baby Things: diapers, diaper cream, formula, soft baby items like wash cloths, blankets, hats, socks, etc.

There is a designated tote in the narthex to collect these items.

## St. John's Response to CDC Announcement

Fellow Disciples,

With proper safety measures in place, St. John's returned to indoor worship in March for the first time in nearly a year. In returning, our top priority then and still is the safety of you and our amazing worship and office staff.

As new data and guidelines come out, the Transition Team and Staff continues to assess, adapt, and implement potential changes. That said, we continue to safely "ease" back into our familiar worship practices and give you options so you may enjoy worship at your comfort level.

On May 9, the 8:30 indoor service was given the choice to sing the Postlude (masks on) together. Those who did not prefer to sing indoors had the opportunity to sneak out early.

On May 16, the 8:30 and 10:15 indoor services had the choice to receive communion at the rail. The little individual communion "coffee creamer shaped" cups were available for those who wish to commune via that method.

With the recent CDC guideline changes, the Transition Team and St. John's Staff met once again to map out St. John's response and next steps.

#### **Indoor Worship at 8:30**

On May 23 at the 8:30 am Traditional Worship service and moving forward, the wearing of a mask or other face covering will be optional, but recommended, for those who are vaccinated.

A mask/face covering is recommended for those who are not fully vaccinated. Additionally,

per the CDC, if you have a condition or are taking medications that weaken your immune system, you may NOT be fully protected. even if you are fully vaccinated and necessary precautions are still recommended (i.e. wearing a mask).

#### Singing

We will continue to sing the Postlude hymn together as a congregation (mask optional, see above). Those who prefer not to sign will have the opportunity to exit before singing begins.

#### Communion

We will continue to have communion at the rail, with the option to commune at your seat using the individual communion "coffee creamer shaped" kits.

#### **Outdoor Worship at 10:00**

Masks/face coverings will be optional for the outdoor services. However, if worship needs to move inside due to the weather, masks are strongly recommended.

#### Singing

Singing outside is encouraged!

#### Communion

We will continue to have communion at the rail, with the option to commune at your seat using the individual communion "coffee creamer shaped" kits.

#### Sunday, June 6

There will be only one service at 9:00 am, outdoors in the circle drive. Annual meeting to follow.

### Groups (Bible/Book Study, Quilters, Memorial Celebrations, etc.) using the church

The wearing of a mask or other face covering will be optional for those who are vaccinated.

A mask/face covering is recommended for those who are not fully vaccinated. Additionally, per the CDC, if you have a condition or are taking medications that weaken your immune system, you may NOT be fully protected. even if you are fully vaccinated and necessary precautions are still recommended (i.e. wearing a mask).

#### Food

We Lutherans enjoy having food when gathering, with that, food is now allowed when gathering indoors.

Thank you to the Transition Team, Staff, and Worship Team for your leadership over the past 14 months and thank you to you for your prayers and support as we work our way back to "normal."


