Pastor Ponders

Summer is the time for rummage sales. I see signs every weekend inviting the community to come to the neighbor's house, garage, front yard to look at all the old stuff that someone has accumulated over the years. I don't often go to one, but I know many do. You never know what you might find. There might be a lamp in the shape of Mickey Mouse that you think would be cute for the children's room, or a poster of Hank Aaron that would look good among all the other Milwaukee sports paraphernalia you've collected. I don't know. And that is the thing. We don't know until we get there what treasures await!

Perhaps if Jesus lived today he would use a rummage sale as one of his parables. Maybe it would go something like this: A woman went to a rummage sale and found an item of great worth among the ordinary things of little value. Knowing that she could purchase this item for dollars that was really worth millions, does she buy it and not say anything? Or does she tell the owner of its true value, thereby not keeping the millions for herself?

The question implied in every parable is: What would you do? By what values would you justify your decision and action? Difficult, right?

Let's say that the item of inestimable worth is the Gospel and it is sitting among all the other messages that the world hears. Do you keep it to yourself and for yourself, or do you reveal it to others?

The rummage sale parable, like all the parables, has a point and a challenge. Just as Jesus' audiences had to struggle with such questions, we are often caught between two very different sets of values. And Jesus always implies the question: What do you choose?

July 22 until all funds have been disbursed


Assistance is offered based on the financial need of youth participants and their families. Up to \$300 per youth participant may be provided to cover registration fees.
