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# Pastor Ponders

October is a beautiful time of year. The summer heat is replaced by warm days and cool evenings. The fall colors are at their peak. Halloween costumes are being taken out or designed for the big night to which every child looks forward. Excursions to an apple orchard revive even the weariest soul.

The church is once again in full swing with Sunday school, adult education classes, and small group gatherings. This year St. John's is offering a new opportunity to become reconnected with the church and its faith life. As many of you know we are offering a new small group ministry opportunity. The Walk by Adam Hamilton is the resource for our small group discussions that will begin this month. Pastor Frank and a group of dedicated volunteers have done a marvelous job in organizing this opportunity. Our intent is to provide everyone an opportunity to connect and reconnect with others in our congregation, with a time in which we can be strengthened and inspired in our faith journeys.

The faith walk is not only ours alone, of course. We walk with others. As our missionaries in other countries know, we walk alongside others, sharing our faith and resources while also receiving their wisdom, strength, and cultural perspectives that enrich us all.

We also walk with others in times of great need. I want to lift up to you the work of the ELCA in its efforts to relieve hunger and to respond to disasters that affect so many people in our country and around the world.

## Hunger facts

- ⇒ 821 million people around the world - that's more than 1 in 10 - can't access the food they need to live active, healthy lives.
- ⇒ According to the most recent estimates, 736 million people live in extreme poverty on less than \$1.90 per day. That's 10% of the world's population.
- ⇒ At some point in 2017 (the most recent year available), more than 40 million people in the United States were unsure where their next meal might come from.
- ⇒ 39.7 million Americans were living in poverty in 2017. For a family of four, this means their annual household income was below \$25,094.

St. John's has been a faithful supporter of the ELCA World Hunger initiative and we will continue to do so. We walk with the people who are directly involved in providing food for those who are hungry, those in our congregation who work in the local food banks or serving meals at the Hope Center. And we support the global efforts through our generous financial support throughout the year.

This fall we will continue walk with each other and those in need all over the world.

There is no cost to participate in KOTK. We just ask that families assist with meals on rehearsal evenings.

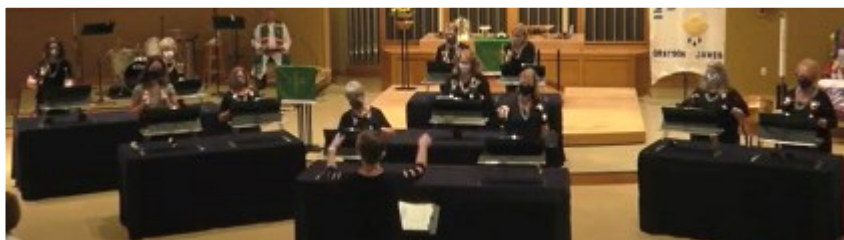
