Autumn is a beautiful time of year. Most of us deeply appreciate the changing colors on the trees and the chill in the air. Autumn means football for us avid fans, perhaps reminiscing about sitting in the stands with our friends on game day and watching the home team win (which didn't happen often at Minnesota) and listening to the pep and marching bands at half time.

Autumn also brings out something else – the crock pot.

During the summer, Cindy and I like to eat lighter fare. Salads figure prominently in our menu planning, especially when the vegetable gardens are producing such good things. In the fall, however, stews begin to make their appearances. Good, hearty stews.

What I love about stews is that you can put almost anything in them, and we all have our own favorite stew recipes. Whether it is meat based or vegetarian, the key is the slow cooking process. To give time for all the ingredients to meld into one fantastic flavor is the secret. In fact stews are often even better the next day, after it has sat in the refrigerator overnight, which allows the melding of flavors to continue.

November 1 is All Saints Day. "Saints" are all true believers on earth and in heaven, both living and dead. A



I pray this news finds you healthy and well. Following are highlights from the October 11 Council meeting.

President Report

- The congregational wide book read, The Walk by Adam Hamilton, focusing on Reconnecting & Renewing our spirituality is underway.
- Preparation for the upcoming Annual Meeting in January, which includes the 2022 budget has begun.
- The outdoor Fall Clean date is scheduled for Saturday, October 23.
- The GROTH Design team continues to meet and explore the potential internal and external design enhancements. The team is currently reviewing prospective costs associated with those ideas. Stay tuned for more details!

Financial Report

- St. John's continues to be blessed by your faithful giving. It is your generosity which allows St. John's to invest in and carry out the ministry goals sets for 2021. Thank you!
- Council approved the financial team's recommendation to transfer \$3,698.57 to the capital improvement fund (CIF).
- Update & Correction: In the October Inspire, I communicated Council approved a transfer of \$46,316.87 to the capital improvement fund (CIF) for the

month of September. The correct dollar amount is \$22,191. My apologies for the error and confusion.

Transition team

 The Transition Team continues to meet on a regular basis to assess the current state of COVID and the Delta variant. The team works closely with the Council and St. John's Staff to thoughtfully map out potential changes to worship and our many ministries. Thank you for your continued support and prayers.


