April is a transitional month. Even though the calendar says spring, it can still remind us of late winter at times. The temperatures can still be cold, and the ground still looks brown and gray. Yet, we know we are past the winter months, and life is coming back to life in the trees and grass around us.

April is also a transitional month in which we are moving out of Lent and getting ready for Easter! This year Easter is on Sunday, April 17, and ushers in the season of Easter. We will read and celebrate the stories of the Risen Christ who appeared to his disciples in surprising and poignant ways.

When I was a student in Santiago, Chile, the Lenten and Easter seasons were just the opposite of how we experience them here in the Northern Hemisphere. Lent is in the autumn and Easter in the late autumn in which the temps are getting colder and the nights longer. It gave me a different perspective on the seasons of the church year and the seasons of the earth. How do you celebrate the renewal of life while at the same time preparing for winter?

We celebrated it in the same way we do here in Wisconsin. By singing, praising, listening to the stories, and giving thanks to the One who is Risen - the One who is Risen in all our seasons of nature and in our lives!

He is Risen indeed! Alleluia!




What's New?

Book Drive



The star of the night was Marcy the Virginia Opossum. We held a Pennies for our Opossum fundraiser to adopt Marcy and we raised \$147.41. We proudly donated all those pennies for her care at Wildlife in Need in Oconomowoc.

Marcy was so interesting to watch as she sat and just nibbled on *dog treats*. We learned where opossums live, how they move (very slowly!) and what helpers they are in our yards eating bugs and ticks. Did you know that opossums don't hang by their tails

like some story books show? And yes, they do have about 13 babies that live in their mommy's pouch until they're old enough to venture out into the big world. You may have one in your back yard living under a pile of leaves in the snow all winter long, too.

Evie the Eastern Fox Snake was so interesting to watch while Helen held her and told us about where she lives right here in our neighborhoods. Children gently touched Evie and handled one of the skins she had shed.

We learned that Jewel the Ornate Box Turtle is an endangered



species here in Wisconsin and how we can, with our grownups, help turtles we might find when they are looking for a place to nest. We need to, if it is safe, to help turtles safely cross the road.

April Outreach Focus: Newborn Kits

Newborn Kits is our Outreach Ministry for April. This is our 24th year of participating in this service project with St. John's donating a total of 11,842 kits so far! Thanks to all who have contributed! We are well on our way towards this year's goal of 600 kits!

Each Newborn Kit consists of 2 cloth diapers, 2 diaper pins, a bath towel, a bath washcloth, a bath bar of Ivory soap, a receiving blanket, a baby hat, and a baby shirt/onesie. The kits will be assembled July 26, so mark your calendars!.

Global Health Ministries delivers these kits to developing nations. The kits are given to new moms, when they deliver their babies at a hospital. This incentive has been very successful at getting expectant moms to a hospital, so their babies can be delivered in sanitary conditions with medical personnel. The new moms are given the kits when they leave. This gives the mom & newborn some much needed supplies to start their new life.

Our current needs are listed below. (Bolded items are most needed.)

- 550 Bars of Ivory Soap (3.17 or 4 oz bath size bars)
- 450 Onesies (Preemie, Newborn, or 0-3 month sizes only)
- 440 Receiving Blankets
- 100 Baby Hats
- Monetary Donations about \$2000.00 (cash or checks payable to St. John's with memo for Newborn Kits) to cover:
 - Diapers
 - Transportation cost to deliver kits to Minnesota
 - Donation to Global
 Health Ministries to help
 with the cost of shipping

- 2 Washcloths

Fellow Disciples,

I pray this finds you healthy and well. Following are highlights from the March 14 Council meeting.

President Report

- Save the date for our Annual Meeting on Sunday, June 5. This meeting primarily focuses on electing new council members along with reviewing annual reports and celebrating our partnership/outreach ministries.
- On Sunday, May 22 we will be holding an update on the GROTH Design work which taken place over the past years.
- Council approved to forward with one of the main goals for 2022; Phase 2 of the sanctuary technology upgrade. Phase 2 consists of upgrading sanctuary projector to produce a brighter and clearer image, replacing the speakers to create a cleaner and more balance sound, and increase the TV size located in the back of sanctuary. Some of the current equipment will be repurposed in other parts of the church.
- We are working with our Greater Milwaukee Synod to schedule a town hall meeting on an upcoming Sunday here at St. John's. This town hall meeting is open for all to attend and is a wonderful opportunity to learn more about the call process, ask questions, and support the Call Committee members.
- Staffing update: In the March Inspire it was reported the Building Supervisor position was filled. Unfortunately, things did not work out as this individual needed to focus on his personal

business. Currently, we have two open positions: Building Supervisor and Office Manager. In this unique and tight labor market we are exploring various ways to fill these positions and duties. If you or someone you know has a calling to support and serve the ministries of St. John's as Building Supervisor or Office Manager, please contact the office for more details.

 Thank you to our gracious volunteers Sandy Paukner, Jo Riley, and Linda Gugel who continue to provide office support and assistance.

Financial Report

- We are off to a slower start than anticipated with general giving down in February. Thankfully, February's expenses were down, and the current overall financials remain in good shape. Thank you for your generosity and faithful giving which allows us to support the many ministry goals for 2022.
- Council approved the financial team's recommendation to transfer \$1,996.23 to the capital improvement fund (CIF).

 The Transition Team continues to monitor ongoing COVID changes, CDC guidelines and the recent subvariants developments.


