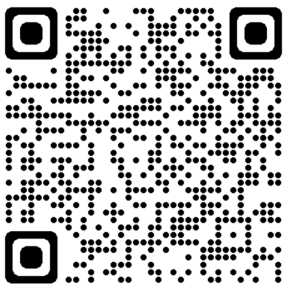

## Pastor Ponders

We begin June with the Sunday of Pentecost. It is the day in which the Holy Spirit who gets the spotlight and who will guide the church over the next 2000 years. Lutherans are known for being people of the second article of the Apostle's Creed, Jesus the Savior, but sometimes the Holy Spirit gets "short shrift". For most of us, it is hard to describe God as three-in-one, and yet this is what we believe.

The apostle Paul writes about the many spirits in the world but there is only one Holy Spirit. Therefore, as he tells his congregations, it is important to discern what spirit or spirits are at play, if you will. The important tell-tale sign of the Holy Spirit is love. Do we act out of love, building each other up, encouraging one another, and providing strength in times of crisis or trouble? If so, the Holy Spirit is within us and directing us in our decision-making and actions. Are we at peace with ourselves and others, giving assurances that God is graceful and full of mercy? Then the Holy Spirit is within us and around us. Can we forgive and ask for forgiveness, to be vulnerable as difficult as that may be. Then the Holy Spirit is within us.

Finally, do we confess our faith in Jesus Christ, for it is the testimony of the Spirit that Christ is risen and will come again to bring all things to himself. That is the mark of the true Spirit.

May God bless you in the name of Jesus through the Holy Spirit!

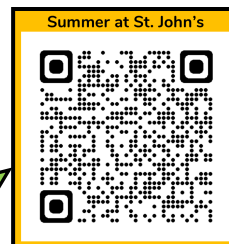

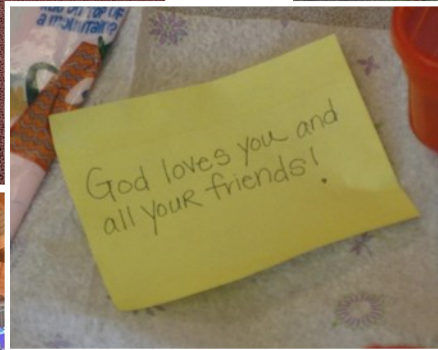

## Waukesha Food Pantry

Summer is a busy time at the Waukesha Food Pantry because children are not in school.

### Commonly Needed Food Items:

- Shelf stable fruits
  - canned in water or juice
  - especially popular - pineapple and mandarin oranges
- Whole grain cereals
- Boxed meal kits
- Ready to eat soups with meat
- Canned pasta with meat
- Shelf stable milk alternatives such as soy or almond milk
- shelf stable proteins such as tuna, chicken, ham, tofu
- 100% fruit juice
- Size 5 & 6 diapers and wipes

The Waukesha Food Pantry picks up donations from St. John's once a month. Donations may be placed in the in the Donation Location blue bin in the Fellowship Hall.

## June Outreach: Offering of Letters

Our outreach effort for June is an **Offering of Letters** to our elected representatives in Washington DC on behalf of the hungry. **This is an at-home activity.**

We take our guidance for these letters from an ecumenical Christian organization called Bread for the World. ([www.Bread.org](http://www.Bread.org)) **Bread for the World** is a collective Christian voice urging our nation's decision makers to end hunger at home and abroad. By changing policies, programs, and conditions that allow hunger and poverty to persist, we provide help and opportunity far beyond the communities in which we live.

This year's Offering of Letters builds on last year's work as Bread members continue to urge Congress to expand anti-hunger programs in response to the pandemic and increase funding for nutrition programs. This year focuses on the bipartisan Global Malnutrition Prevention and Treatment Act which will authorize USAID to advance targeted programs to prevent and treat malnutrition around the world; ensure an elevated focus on nutrition programs across global health, food systems, and other sectors; and require robust monitoring of these interventions to ensure the effective use of taxpayer dollars. **Urge our Senators to cosponsor S. 2956.** (It's already passed in the house of Representatives)

Resource packets are available in the Narthex including a sample letter, envelopes, and more information about Bread for the World, as well as details regarding this year's specific asks. There are links to the same information on the church website under “Resources - Documents and Forms”.

## President Report

## Financial Report

- The April financial reports showed a better trend in giving compared to February and March. It was reported in the month of February we were off to a slow start with general giving. Unfortunately, March financials also reported a lower than anticipated general giving amount. The Finance Team and

- It was recommended and approved that we do not transfer any money into the Capital Improvement Fund (CIF) this month due to the inconsistent giving trends.

## Creation Corner

### Get to Know Your Fridge!

Refrigerators are a major energy consumer in homes. If the temp is just 10 degrees colder than necessary, your unit can consume 25% more energy monthly! Check the temp by placing a digital thermometer inside and closing the door for 20 minutes. Ideal temps should be 4-5 degrees F for the freezer and 37-40 degrees F for the refrigerator. Use your temperature controls to adjust up or down and then recheck an hour later.
