PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Please complete the St. John's family registration form available online. It applies to all programs below and all Children, Youth & Family events. Only one registration per family needed.

Our Confirmation program at St. John's begins with a pre-Confirmation 2-year Bible Overview Class in 5th & 6th grade. Formal Confirmation Classes with Pastor Brian begin in 7th & 8th grade. In 9th grade, students put their faith into action with monthly gatherings, participation in High School Youth Group, and a Lutherdale Retreat, and then are Confirmed in May. We expect families to participate in worship on a regular basis.

5th & 6th Grade Connect Class

5th & 6th Graders meet on Sunday evenings, every other week, from 4:30pm-6:00pm. In these two years, students are engaged in a Bible overview using the Connect Curriculum. This is a fun and engaging class! The first day of class is October 9.

4:30-4:50pm Light Meal (eaten outdoors when weather allows) **5:00-6:00pm** Connect Class

Students can come just for the class portion if you prefer.

7th & 8th Grade Confirmation Class

7th & 8th Graders meet on Sunday evenings, every other week, from 4:30pm-6:00pm. In these two years, students are engaged in a Confirmation program led by Pastor Brian, Joanna Salinas and guest leaders. The first day of class is October 2.

4:30-4:50pm Light Meal (eaten outdoors when weather allows) **5:00-6:00pm** Confirmation Class

Students can come just for the class portion if you prefer.

9th Grade Confirmation Class & Confirmation Day

In fall, students begin to work toward their day of Confirmation in May.

There are 3 things in which students participate:

- Meet monthly with their class.
- Attend an overnight retreat with their mentor
- Attend High School youth group Sunday mornings.

Sunday Mornings

8:30am Traditional Worship

This is our traditional indoor worship with the organ, choir, handbells, special music and liturgy.

9:30am 6th-8th Graders/Sunday Morning Youth Leadership Team

Back by popular demand! 6th-8th Graders can share their faith through volunteering as student leaders for Sunday School and within the larger congregation. They will serve a variety of roles. The first day of YLT is Sept. 18ⁿ. **Adult leaders needed!

5th graders will still participate in the Sunday School program.

10:30 am Family Worship

This is a family-oriented worship experience with a Children's message, family blessing time, and shortened liturgy. This is our contemporary service with the band, with added interactive components designed to engage the entire family. We encourage our Middle Schoolers to serve as worship leaders if they are comfortable in either this service or the 8:30 traditional service. This includes reading the lesson, reading the prayers, serving communion, and ushering. These can all be done as a family as well. Ex) Parent/child read the lesson together.

Monthly Social & Service Events

Middle Schoolers will be invited to monthly scheduled events where they can build community with each other, St. John's, and the greater church through play, serving, and retreats. Not all events are for all grade levels.

Expectations for 7th-8th Grade Confirmation Students

Behavioral Expectations

- 1. Students will be respectful of each other and adult leaders.
- 2. Students will stay home if not feeling well.
- 3. Families will notify Joanna for contact tracing if they have a positive Covid test/symptoms within 3 days of attending an event.
- 4. Students can bring phones but cannot use them during programming.
- 5. Students will follow St. John's current Covid policy, which may change throughout the year. That policy can be found on St. John's website.

Program Expectations

1) Class Attendance

2) Worship Leadership Participation (at least 5 times per year)

Students may serve as Acolytes, Ushers, Readers, Communion Assistants, A/V Assistant, or musician. Training for these roles will be provided.

3) Youth Leadership Team (at least 5 times per year)

4) **Confirmation Retreat** (At least 1 during 7-8th grade Confirmation Years)

5) **Monthly events** are not required but will help make you feel connected to your faith community and give you the opportunity to show your faith through service to others.

Parent Expectations

Parents are the #1 influence in their student's faith development. Your leadership and your partnership are needed.

- Help your student meet the expectations outlined above and hold them accountable to taking ownership of their faith journey.
- Attend worship regularly with your student.
- Model a life of faith.
- Be open to conversations about your faith, your experiences, your questions.
- Be involved in the middle school ministry through volunteer service

<u>COSTS</u>

There is no cost for Sunday School or Confirmation.

Middle School events, particularly the Lutherdale retreat may involve costs per student. Scholarships are available to those with financial need upon request (please contact the Pastor or Joanna if you have need for financial assistance).
