



## Moses is Topic of Next St. John's Academy

Testament at Lutheran Theological Seminary

Who is Dr. Kristine Ruffatto?

Teaching and the Old Testament were two of Kristine's passions even before she went to seminary. She incorporated these gifts into her missionary work in the Central African Republic and as a pastor in the ELCA. One of the ELCA calls, in which she served alongside her pastor



husband, Scot, was at St. John's from 2003-2011.

In 2011, Kristine took a deep breath and made the decision to accept a call as Professor of Old Testament at Lutheran Theological Seminary Saskatoon. There, she provided a generation of pastors and other students with a strong foundation in Biblical Studies, Pastoral Care, and Cross-Cultural Studies.
