




#### **Sunday School**



And the rest is history as they say. Paul begins a series of missionary journeys across Asia Minor and Greece, helping to establish Christianity.

- Prior to our Annual Meeting, budget listening sessions will be held January 19 and 22.
- Thank you to the Financial Secretaires, Finance Team, St. John's Staff, and Council members for your diligent work on preparing the 2023 budget. Your support and dedication are greatly appreciated.
- A letter regarding the St. John's Building Improvements is being sent out on the 19. As highlighted in the letter, we will

discuss the needed improvements and next steps in greater detail at the annual meeting on January 29.

#### Financial Report

- Council agreed with the Finance's Team recommendation not to transfer any money into the Capital Improvement Fund (CIF) this month.
- The balance of the Capital Improvement Fund (CIF) as of January 10 was \$112,347.31



This Winter Farmers Market, hosted by **St. John's Lutheran Church**, is a project jointly sponsored by **Food**, **Faith and Farming Network** and the **Harvest of Hope Farm Crisis Fund** of the Madison Christian Community; both are non-profit organizations supporting Wisconsin family farmers since the 1980s.
