Pastor Ponders

Like many of you, I am ready for the time of Spring, preferably late Spring when the trees are once again leafed with green and the flowers are blooming. It will come – eventually. It always does. The transition to Spring, however, is the difficult part. We wait, watch, and go through our routines of daily life.

The description I gave above sounds more like Advent than Lent, but both are really transition points – one for the birth of Christ and the other for the Resurrection!

During our Lenten season this year, we prepare for Holy Week by retracing the steps and journeys of the apostle Paul, who himself was the most important figure in another transition – the transition between Christ's ascension and the Day of Pentecost to the birth of the Church. In fact, as Adam Hamilton in his book <u>The Call</u> that we have begun reading in our small groups, ventures to say that without Paul, Christianity would have remained a small Jewish sect in a backwater territory in the Roman Empire and not the world-wide movement that has taken shape over the last 2,000 years.

We will explore Paul's journeys and incorporate our own into this transition story, as we wait, watch, and work in this time between the Resurrection and the fulfillment of God's realm in the end time.

I look forward to your journeys of faith during this Lenten time of Spring!

Outreach Opportunities

Outreach for Hope

On Sunday, March 19, Pastor Chris Manke. Executive Director of Outreach for Hope (OFH) will be visiting and preaching at St. John's. Many at St. John's are familiar with OFH mainly through their September Ride, Run, Walk fund raiser. OFH is a legally separate entity affiliated with the Greater Milwaukee Synod of the ELCA. It's main goal is to provide partnerships and funding to support efforts of inner city Lutheran congregations (Milwaukee, Racine, Kenosha and Waukesha) in their neighborhoods and at their churches. OFH provides support to develop specific programing efforts and then provides grants to fund them - 20 grants are being given in 2023 worth more than \$240,000. These grants are awarded annually and are funded through the Bike Ride effort. However, OFH also raises funds throughout the year for specific efforts (Super Bowl food drive; Coats for Kids; etc.) and to provide funding to support running the organization. OFH is not a congregational budget item at St. John's, so please consider the opportunity to support its ongoing ministry.

The Women's Center can house up to 20 guests at one time. Some women stay for as long as

transition homes in the area. It is easy to see the great need for the donated items.



Council Communications

Fellow Disciples,

I pray this news finds you healthy and well. Following are highlights from the February 20 Council meeting.

President Report

- The 2023 budget was approved at our Annual Meeting on January 29.
- Additional highlights from the Annual Meeting included a lengthy discussion regarding the three building improvements proposed for 2023.
- The three improvements are: fixing and painting the exterior, repairing/resurfacing the circle drive, and improving the exterior signage on Barker Road.
- Currently, proposals for the three projects are being vetted to determine a cost so our capital champaign can begin.

Financial Report

- Council agreed and approved with the Finance's Team recommendation to transfer \$1,270.90 into the Capital Improvement Fund (CIF) this month.
- The balance of the Capital Improvement Fund (CIF) as of February 13 was \$112,347.31.

Transition team

• With COVID numbers at stable levels, the Transition Team has switched to an ad hoc status.

March Outreach Focus

Our outreach focus for March is the FOOD Pantry Serving Waukesha County. They provide food, hope, and dignity to county residents in need, and advocate to increase awareness of hunger through community partnerships. The FOOD Pantry serves Waukesha County residents who are children, elderly, working but underemployed, Individuals with disabilities or health issues, and temporarily unemployed.

Most Commonly Needed Food Items:

- Shelf stable fruits canned in water or its own juice
- Whole grain cereals
- Ready to eat soups with meat
- Canned pasta with meat
- Shelf stable milk alternatives: such as soy or almond milk
- shelf stable proteins: tuna, chicken, ham, tofu
- 100% Fruit Juice



Infant and Toddler Needs:

- * Formula especially Similac
- * Diapers especially size 5 & 6
- * Pull-Ups any size
- * Baby wipes
- * Pediasure
- * NO baby food needed at this time
