Our outreach effort for June is an **Offering of Letters** to our elected representatives in Washington DC on behalf of the hungry. This is an at-home activity. We take our guidance for these letters from an ecumenical Christian organization called Bread for the World. (Bread.org).

This year's Offering of Letters focuses on the Farm Bill. The goal is to help craft a Farm Bill that builds healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems. The impact of the farm bill is significant. It not only affects the agriculture and food sectors - it can play a huge role in ending food insecurity and hunger in the U.S. and save the lives of millions abroad. To write a letter:

- 3. Use the QR code to send an electronic letter.




## Calling All VBS Camp Counselors & Volunteers!



### Fellow Disciples,

Following are highlights from the May 15 Council meeting.

President Report

- Mark your calendars, Sunday, June 4 will be the Annual Program Meeting. This meeting will be held outside after the conclusion of the outdoor 9:00 am service. The goal is to begin at 10:15.
- Starting in September, St. John's will launch a capital champaign to support necessary repairs and enhancement projects, which include reconstructing the circle drive and improving the exterior signage on Barker Road. We ask you to prayerfully consider how you may support these upcoming projects.
- This wonderful news is worth repeating from prior month's Council meeting. The Property Team was asked to quantify their estimated value and savings for the church. In the first three

months of 2023, their skills have saved St. John's over \$5,000 in labor costs. Thank you, Property Team members, for sharing your time and talents.

**Financial Report** 

- The balance of the Capital Improvement Fund (CIF) as of May 2, was \$113,618.21.
- April's giving was 18% below our budgeted amount. While expenses also remain below budget, this trend is not expected to continue with upcoming expenditures.
- Thank you for your faithful giving! Your gracious gifts allow St. John's to carry out the many ministries planned for 2023.




