

Coming This Fall - Short Stories by Jesus



President Report

- Council welcomed Liz Roth to an At-Large seat. Liz was elected to Council at the Congregational Meeting in June. We look forward to her insight and guidance in the leadership and visioning of St. John's. Thank you to outgoing At-Large Council member Kris Wasserman for her service to St. John's.
- Council approved the terms of Rich Warp and Phil Peters to serve on the Endowment Committee. Rich and Phil will be filling the Committee seats of Phil Lange and Mark Sabin who completed their committee seat term. Thank you, Phil and Mark, for your leadership and service to an amazing ministry.

 Work for the upcoming Pave the Way campaign, which will fund crucial property improvements maintenance and repairs, and ministry enhancements continues to shape up. Stay tuned for additional news and announcements in the upcoming month!

Financial Report

- Thank you for your faithful giving! As of July 8 financials, your gracious giving has allowed St. John's to carry out the many programs wonderful ministries in 2023. Additionally. we have been able to set aside \$12,102,31 in funds, which will be put towards reducing the 2023 budget deficit. As a reminder, the 2023 budget approved by the congregation at the Annual Meeting had an approximate \$37,000 deficit.
- The balance of the Capital Improvement Fund (CIF) as of July 8 was \$113,631.59.

- Engaging children and youth in the life of the church.


