## **Pastor Ponders**

Autumn is a time for harvests. We give thanks to God for the bounty of the land that produces the food we need to survive and to thrive.

Our emphasis in September is on the ways in which we can share in God's abundance to those who are in great need, who don't know where their next meal is coming from. St. John's has been and continues to be extremely supportive in the efforts to alleviate food insecurity and hunger around the world and in our local communities. Your generosity in giving to the ELCA World Hunger programs, the local food pantries, and the partnerships with Los Héroes, All Peoples, and the Meru diocese is a testament to faith in action! These efforts not only supply food to where it is needed, but it also supports the efforts to teach and accompany people so that they can be self-reliant. From the old adage: we not only give people fish but also teach them how to fish.

Hunger is a complex issue. Not only does it involve bringing in the harvest and sharing it with others, but it also an issue of distribution of the resources. In many countries caught in brutal civil wars, food is often used as a weapon, withholding the food supplies to inflict pain on their enemies, It is sin at its deepest level that the poor and powerless in societies often bear the brunt and suffer because of these struggles for power.

Economic and political structures also hinder or block food relief. When people are working for low wages, they often must make the excruciatingly difficult decision whether to pay for groceries or the heating and electric bill. When supplemental resources for food subsidies are cut or eliminated, the demand on the food pantries becomes dire, as is told to us by those at All People's. It is the children who suffer the most, whose needs for nutrition are entwined with their being able to grow both physically and academically.

As a church we are called to do more than just handing out turkeys on Thanksgiving and Christmas. It means that we take seriously these issues of food insecurity and wrestle with its structural complexities. It calls us to advocate, as Bread for the World does, for ways in which more people are able to receive assistance in order for them to thrive in a society that is at peace and secure.

This is the work that God is calling us to do. St. John's continues to answer that call with the efforts we support through our global mission partners, advocacy through Bread for the World, and our local hunger initiative.

Thank you for all that you do! May God continue to bless you in the vital mission God has set before you.

The festivities will also include music, games for children and adults, and great fellowship.




