### **Pastor Ponders**

November is a time for harvest. Agriculturally, the farmers have been hard at work bringing in the corn that has been growing and maturing since spring. Farmers begin planning for next year's crops. The ground begins to rest in the winter as it prepares and repairs itself for the next spring planting. Of course, on a dairy farm the work continues, as the cows need to be fed and milked. But even here, the hay that has been gathered in the summer is used now in the winter months. There is a seasonal rhythm to farm life. Perhaps that is why Jesus used many agricultural metaphors in his teachings.

There is a seasonal rhythm to life in the church as well. We begin November with All Saints Sunday, followed by Thanksgiving, and then normally end with the first Sunday in Advent. This is only part of the overall seasons of the church year, each part integrated into the others in order to see the larger picture of faith life. In the midst of so much change, there is a beauty in the constancy or rhythms of life that center us and ground us.



Yet change occurs on a constant basis as well. As we say, "things change, people change" quickly or over a long period of time. Adaptation is a key to living and thriving. In each season we learn to adapt within the rhythms of nature, the church, and in our own personal lives. This is how God has created and continues to create the world.

We give great thanks in all seasons, but particularly in November, the harvest season. We will once again join family and friends to celebrate the gifts of God and the blessing God bestows. Whether we give thanks for the saints who have passed on before us, or for the family and friends that gather around the table on Thanksgiving, or in the preparation for the coming of the Lord, we know that we have a loving God in all seasons!


#### PAVE THE WAY

It is important to recognize that the writings of the New Testament are significantly polemical. The earliest followers of Jesus – Jews themselves - sought to justify their beliefs and practices over against those of other Jewish groups. The earliest Christians saw themselves as the true heirs of the religion of Israel.

After learning what a firefighter looks like when they would be helping us, everyone got a turn to spray the giant fire hose. It was the best part of the visit.





### El Salvador is November Outreach Focus

The focus for the November Mission of Healing Outreach Collection will be health education centered in Los Héroes with a heavy emphasis on reproductive health education (boys and girls) and the Days for Girls project. Based on greatest need (and what is not available in El Salvador) here are the needed items:

- New cotton flannel (darker prints, pre-wash and dry it)
- Girls cotton undies size 12 16 (not white)
- PUL fabric (white, solid color, flower or geometric)
- Babyville Boutique plastic snaps size 20
- Regular size bandages, large bandages, gauze, first aid tape, curlex wrap (for wound care in the community).

### Safety/Emergency Wall Updated

We have updated our safety/emergency wall! The items remain located on the wall by the library and office, just moved slightly to the left. In addition to the first aid kit and fire extinguisher, we have an easier-to-use AED (automated external defibrillator) that has a pediatric option and have added an OAK box (Overdose Aid Kit) for opioid overdoses. The Town of Brookfield Emergency Services is pleased to know we have these items,



and have them easily accessible.


