

We often hear people say, "I can't believe it is already Christmas!" It is true. The Advent/ Christmas season is upon us – seasons of anticipation and fulfillment. We look forward to lighting the candles during the Advent services, culminating in the Christmas eve services in which we light candles, turn off the lights, and sing Silent Night. Pave the (Royal High)Way

In Advent we sing a very familiar hymn "Prepare the Royal Highway", a hymn that recalls the travel in Jesus' time, when royalty would travel by caravan. Before they began their journey, however, people, usually slaves, would have to prepare the roads so that the royal caravan could traverse the landscape on an even plane.


Good maintenance of the roads was essential for trade, and Palestine was right along the trade routes between the empires in the north and east and Egypt in the south. The ports in Palestine along the Mediterranean Sea were also vital to the commerce and wealth of the region.

Although St. John's is not on a major trade route, persons who walk or drive by see our church and can get an impression of us by what they see. Therefore, it is important for us as a church, with a beautiful building, to keep the exterior and interior, including parking lots, landscaping, signage, and furnishings up to date and attractive as possible. We want to continue to be an inviting facility that cares for the "travelers" along the way.

With our "Pave the Way" campaign and projects, we are doing just that. So far, we have received pledges totaling over \$250,000 on our way to the goal of \$300,000. Over 80 persons have made a commitment to move forward with our plans. Because of your generosity we will fulfill our commitment to upgrading and beautifying our church. Our plans will come to fruition by the grace of God and your dedication.



Advent Devotion

Family history

Being a Jew in the first century included with it a certain amount of pride in your ancestors. Jewish families would tell stories about the patriarchs of old times: Abraham and his daring faith, Isaac and his miracle birth, Jacob and his wrestling with God. And you can't forget the heroism and leadership of King David.

It was expected, then, that when Matthew wrote an account of Jesus' life, he would begin with a list of Jesus' ancestors. And he did. But what was unexpected were the ancestors that Matthew highlighted. Here are just a few names from Matthew chapter 1: "Judah the father of Perez and Zerah, whose mother was Tamar. ... Salmon the father of Boaz, whose mother was Rahab. ... David was the father of Solomon, whose mother had been Uriah's wife" (verses 3,5,6).

What's the point? Matthew didn't shy away from the darker side of Jewish history. By referencing Tamar, Rahab, and Uriah's wife (feel free to research their stories later today), Matthew made one thing abundantly clear: The kind of people Jesus came from were far from perfect. In fact, Jesus' family history contained some embarrassing stories and questionable characters.

So why would God want Matthew to highlight these people from Jesus' family tree? If you keep reading about Jesus' life, the point makes itself clear: The kind of people Jesus came from are the kind of people Jesus came for.

It doesn't matter how embarrassing or questionable your past is. Jesus came for people like you. And people like me.

Creation Corner

Use Recyclable Wrapping Paper!

Americans throw away 25% more trash during the Thanksgiving to New Year's holiday period than any other time of year. The extra waste amounts to 25 million tons of garbage, or about 1 million textra tons per week!

Reduce impact your considering how you wrap your gifts. A general rule of thumb is that regular wrapping paper (including the glossy stuff) is often recyclable as long as it doesn't have nonpaper additives. Metallic embellishments, glitter, plastic-coated items will land your paper in the landfill. Bows, string, tissue paper and ribbon should also not be recycled. Consider using reusable bags and saving bows, ribbon, boxes, and other wrapping items for reuse.



I pray this news finds you healthy and well as we wrap up the beautiful colors of Fall and we now have been blessed with a little blanket of snow. The following are highlights from the November 20 Council meeting.

President Report

- Pave the Way update: Part of the circle drive reconstruction project with Poblocki Paving included crack filing and repainting the parking lot. In November, the cracks were filled to help prolong the life of the parking lot. Poblocki wrapped up this first phase, by painting/striping two additional and creating handicap spaces.
- Pave the Way financial tithe update: Council voted to move forward with our tithe commitment to the Hope Center. With the exterior painting project complete, St. John's will tithe \$2.786.35 to the Hope Center. Future tithe will be issued after we complete further projects authorized as part of the Pave the Way Campaign.

- Congratulations to Sue Smith on her retirement. We were so blessed for Sue's support and expertise over the past year and half. We wish Sue all the best in the next chapter of her
- With Sue's retirement, St. John's is looking to hire an Administrative Assistant. Interested individuals should contact the office for additional details.
- approved Council the recommendation brought forth by the Endowment Committee to distribute \$7,150. Thank you Endowment Committee, for your work on this amazing ministry.
- Budgeting for 2024 is underway.

Financial Report

- As we near the end of the year, I want to thank you for your faithful and gracious giving.
- Based on October's year to date financial reports, our year to date giving may not reach projected estimates, though with our fiscal responsible spending we may be

able to meet expenses based on the current giving trends.

The balance of the Capital Improvement Fund (CIF) as of November 12 was \$114.231.59.


