Pastor Ponders

During this month of February, the church will observe Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent and the start of the journey to Good Friday. It is a time of reflection on our mortality and a time for many to observe spiritual disciplines such as fasting or "giving up something for Lent". Most importantly, it is a time in which we realign ourselves to the teachings of Christ and understanding more deeply his sacrifice for us.

This year, Ash Wednesday falls upon the secular observance of Valentines Day, a Hallmark-driven idea of love and romance that traditionally includes flowers, cards, chocolate, and for children, candy shaped hearts with small messages like "Be Mine" on them. It can also be a day filled with some guilt if you had forgotten that it was Valentine's Day and your partner did not. If that is the case, then an imposition of ashes of the forehead might be a proper conclusion for the day! Both the religious and secular observances reflect an aspect of love – the romantic and the sacrificial. The depth, however, is what differentiates the two. Whereas romantic love can ebb and flow, the love of God in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ for us is everlasting and constant. Human feelings can be fleeting and ephemeral, but God's love for us is grounded in the very being of God in God's self.

How do we know this? We know this in faith. We know this in God's revelation to us through his Son. We know this in the power of the Holy Spirit who gives us the strength to carry on the good work we do and to do it with the love of Christ our Lord.

Lenten Fasting

The practice of fasting (or "giving something up") during Lent is not required for Lutherans because it is not commanded in Holy Scripture. Rather, as a matter of Christian freedom, starving oneself of a pleasure of the flesh is a way to remember daily the great sacrifice of Jesus on the cross to pay for the world's sin.

Here are some ideas for things to give up for Lent

- A favorite toy or game
- Social media for a day
- A favorite snack
- Drinking only water at school
- A favorite chair at home or seat at school.

At the start of Lent, we should ask ourselves – what pulls me away from loving God, loving others, and loving myself well? How can I incorporate acts of sacrifice, acts of giving, and acts of prayer that will help me love as God loves?

Giving thought to observing Lent is important. Whether you wait until the last minute to decide or you've known your Lenten sacrifice since last Lent, it's worth spending time to thoughtfully consider how to make the most of your experience this year.

Because observing Lent is so much bigger than what you "give up."


Learning, Coping, and Surviving as an Alzheimer's Caregiver

I pray this news finds you healthy and well. The following are highlights from the January 22 Council meeting.

President Report

- Council approved a preliminary 2024 budget for a congregational vote at the upcoming Annual Meeting on Sunday, February 4 at 5:00 pm in Financial Report Fellowship Hall.
- Thank you to the St. John's staff and Finance Team, for your fiscal responsibility in preparing this budget.
- In conjunction to the Annual Meeting, Council and the Finance Team will conduct budget listening sessions on Thursday January 25 @ 6:30 and Sunday, January 28 between services to review the 2024 budget.

 Thanks to your generous Pave the Way pledge commitments Council has approved to move forward with the paving of the circle drive and the installation of the new circle drive lights (we do not own the current lights, as they are in a rental agreement with, We Energy). Hopefully that project can begin in the spring when weather permits.

THANK YOU for your faithful and gracious giving throughout the year as I am happy to report the 2023 financials wrapped up on a positive note. We will acknowledge and celebrate this wonderful news at the upcoming Annual Meeting on February 4.

With more than 45 days cash on hand, Council approved to transfer \$6.000.00 to the Capitol Improvement Fund.

February Birthdays

- Point of reference: To determine the amount of funds which can be set aside. The Finance Team and Council review the daily cash on hand calculation and value. If there is more than 45 days cash on hand, funds beyond the 45 days cash on hand, is then eligible for discussion, recommendation, and approval.
- The balance of the Capital Improvement Fund (CIF) as of January 3 was \$114,248.64


