The Lenten season is once again upon us. It is a time of reflection, introspection, and repentance. We often associate Lent with a burdensome feeling, especially when Lent is in the month of March. Winter is still clinging while spring is just a glimpse.

The gospel readings during Lent also point to the difficult and burdensome journey of Jesus. He understands where this journey is leading. He knows that he cannot avoid what is inevitable – his sacrifice on the cross. Although he tells his disciples of the journey they are undertaking, he knows that they cannot truly comprehend the significance of what they are doing or where they are going.

We are also on a journey in this life, and we too know where this is leading. We cannot avoid death and that thought can feel burdensome at times. Yet we are not alone in all of this. We have our community of believers with whom we travel. The burden is shared.

Most importantly we are traveling with the one who rose again from the dead and promises us the gift of life after death. As Jesus told his disciples, ²⁸ "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." (Matt. 11:28-30)

Let us continue to walk with Christ in this Lenten season, for the joy of the resurrection will be coming.





They rescue adult dogs and puppies from all over the country and find them good homes. Some of the dogs have been abandoned, some abused and others rescued from puppy mills.

Animals have always been important to me! We rescued our dog Dazzie from Hoovers Haws two years ago at ten months old. She is a Red Heeler/American pit bull terrier mix. She was abandoned and abused. She

and her two sisters were found as puppies in a plastic garbage bag on the side of a highway in Texas. When we decided to begin fostering her, she was scared of us, of new surroundings, of other people and animals. Now she is the best dog! She is loving, sweet, playful and loves people and other animals. She just needed the right people to give her love and patience! She plays with our cats and at the dog park all the time! My



grandma also adopted her dog, Oshee, from Hoovers Hause, at 12 weeks old, in 2020. She and her brothers and sisters were also abandoned. She is a dachshund/miniature pinscher mix and so cuddly and sweet.

I want all these sweet dogs to find a home where they can be happy and loved! Hoovers Hause is a non profit and runs only by donation. If it wasn't for the community, these dogs would not have shelter, food,

President Report

- St. John's will have a new IT vendor effective mid-March. GO TECH IT, located in Brookfield, will take over our IT services. We look forward to working with GO TECH IT to enhance our IT needs in the ever-changing world of technology.
- Effective February, Avenue Systems became our Audio/ Visual (A/V) vendor for the sanctuary equipment.
- Pave the Way updates: The reconstruction of the circle drive and the installation of the new lights (we do not own the current

lights, as they are in a rental agreement with We Energy) is scheduled for May and expected to last one week. The beginning phase of the narthex revamp is This includes the underway. construction of the "bump out", which is an intentional focal point in the narthex and serves as additional usher room storage. Currently, painting of the narthex area is underway. Thank you to all of those involved in these projects. Truly, many hands make light work.

- St. John's is looking to hire an additional part time Custodian. Interested individuals should contact the church office for details.
- The Save the date: We will hold our next Congregational Meeting on June 2.

Financial Report

- On February 4, St John's held the Annual Meeting, at which time the 2024 budget was voted on and approved.
- The balance of the Capital Improvement Fund (CIF) as of February 6 was \$120,248.64

- Engaging children and youth in the life of the church.


