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Pastor Ponders

The day of Pentecost, May 19, is a Sunday in which we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is depicted in the book of Acts as a great wind that blew through the community, leaping like flames, and causing people to speak in various languages. It is a day in which traditionally we wear red in worship, the color that represents fire or passion.

Before he ascended into heaven, Jesus promised us that he would send an Advocate to empower the disciples to continue the work began by Jesus. In fact, a former professor of mine once said that the Book of Acts really should be called the Acts of the Holy Spirit, since it was the Holy Spirit that inspired the disciples to evangelize throughout the near East.

What is the Holy Spirit's function? Let us hear from Martin Luther:

"The Holy Ghost has two offices. First, He is a Spirit of grace, that makes God gracious unto us, and receives us as His acceptable children, for Christ's sake. Secondly, He is a Spirit of prayer, that prays for us, and for the whole

world, to the end that all evil may be turned from us, and that all good may happen to us. The Spirit of grace teaches people; the Spirit of prayer prays . . . For we must first hear the Word, and then afterwards the Holy Ghost works in our hearts; He works in the hearts of whom He will, and how He will, but never without the Word."

Luther always centered his theology and teachings in the Word of God. He centered his whole being in the Word. It is the Word of God that inspires, strengthens, and renews us for the tasks at hand - for the glory of God. This is why we are here – to give glory to God in all that we do. We can only do this by the gift of the Holy Spirit, who blows where and when God wills it to go. We can see the effects of the Spirit each and every day, always keeping vigilant to its direction and power.

As people, baptized in the Spirit, let us walk confidently in the grace of God made known to us by the Holy Spirit!


Scholarship Students Send Salutations

- Engaging children and youth in the life of the church.


