


The bluegrass music team returns on June 9 for the 10:00 worship.

 Accompaniment - We agree to walk with each other and Jesus as we develop relationships based on mutuality, vulnerability, empowerment, inclusivity, and sustainability.

 Prayer - We agree to pray for each other on a regular basis, including our weekly worship services.

 Communication - We agree to communicate regularly with our companions, sharing stories from the life of our congregations and ministries.

 Visits - We agree to exchange visits by members and leaders of our congregations and ministries as frequently as possible.

 Education - We agree to seek out information about each other's country, history, life, and ministry.

 Support - We agree to inform each other about projects within our ministry plan and to invite mutual participation in our mission.

Supporting Our Brothers & Sisters in Tanzania

Parish to Congregation Partnerships: Many congregations in the Greater Milwaukee Synod have developed relationships with parishes in Meru. Other congregations support the general ministry.

Council Communications

Fellow Disciples,

The following are highlights from the May 20 Council meeting.

President Report

- Thank you to those who came out to help support the Spring Clean-up on Monday, May 6. With the amazing turnout, we were able to tidy up much of the landscaping around the church.
- Pave the Way Finance update: As of April 30, \$221,671 of the \$308,000 Pave the Way pledges have been received.
- Pave the Way Projects update: The circle drive restoration was originally set for early May, but due to weather delays Poblocki Paving now hopes to begin May 28. The circle drive restoration will take approximately 1 week to complete.
- The Interiors Team attended the Council meeting to present their vision and recommendation for the

furniture upgrades in the Narthex. After discussion and review, Council approved the furniture proposal.

- Council will continue to move forward with the Pave the Way projects only when funds are available to complete the projects. After the circle drive restoration project is complete, an update will be shared regarding the pledges collected, funds spent, projects completed, and projects remaining.
- Save the date: We will hold our Congregational Meeting on June 2 at 10:15 in Fellowship Hall.
- On a personal note: As my term as President winds down, I want to thank the St. John's Community for their support over the past four years.

Financial Report

• The balance of the Capital Improvement Fund (CIF) as of May 5 was \$120,248.64

June Birthdays

- The Finance Team and Council agreed to take advantage of interest rates and put \$100,000 of the Capital Improvement Fund a in short term CD.
- After closing April's books, St. John's year to date expenses were 2% below the budgeted amount. Unfortunately, giving year to date is 22% below budget. Council and the Finance Team will continue to monitor these unsustainable trends.
- Thank you for your generosity and faithful giving which allows us to support the many ministry goals for 2024.


