Pastor Ponders

In last month's newsletter I wrote about Cindy and my trip to Greece/ Turkey, following the footsteps of the apostle Paul. Having returned from the trip, I can tell you that it was an excursion of a lifetime! Led by my colleagues at the seminary and with the guidance of great tour guides from those areas, we learned so much about the history, culture, religions, and archeology of that period.

We realized that Paul was writing his letters to specific congregations in specific areas of the Mediterranean within certain contexts. Visiting the sites where Paul was, or at least we think he was, we were able to get a much fuller picture in our minds of what it may have been like living in the time of Paul. We now have a greater appreciation of Paul's missions and the hardships he endured in order to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ. I can confidently say that without Paul, the church might have stayed as a remote and regional religious cult and not the Christianity we know todav.

Standing at the river in Phillipi where Paul supposedly baptized Lydia, we as a group stood in that stream and sang "Shall We Gather at the River", feeling the power of the Holy Spirit in that moment. We stood in the place near the acropolis in Athens where Paul preached to the Athenians (and he got into some trouble because of it!) We traveled to the island of Patmos where it is thought that John wrote the book of Revelation. And we visited the area of Cappadocia where the Christians lived and worshiped in caves. seeing the beautiful frescoes that adorned those caverns.

As I said, it was an excursion of a lifetime. Now that I am back I have been reading the letters of Paul with a greater appreciation of his thought, context, and purpose of what he was doing two thousand years ago. Here we are today, building upon the work that Paul began all those years ago.





If you stop by St. John's the week of July 29, you are sure to experience a unique and fun event – Summer Handbell Camp 2024. Director Heidi Bischmann and members of our handbell choir will participate in this exciting, educational event. A total group size of 32-37 people is anticipated to fill positions in two or more handbell choirs. Participants are from various churches, schools and community handbell choirs from around the state of Wisconsin and Michigan.

Summer Handbell Camp is a four-day intensive workshop focused on handbell technique and musicianship. Daily rehearsals and individual practice emphasize hands-on learning and group performance. Music selections will range in difficulty from Level 2+ to Level 4+ of both sacred and secular music for use throughout the year. Well known composer and clinician Sandra Eithun will direct the mass choirs in a fast-paced group setting to make this workshop enjoyable for musicians interested in improving their handbell performance.

There will be a free concert on Thursday, August 1 at 7:00 pm in the sanctuary featuring the 14 handbell selections from the workshop with guest instrumentalists on piano, flute and percussion.



Is This a Handicapped Parking Spot or Not?



How Many Handicapped Parking Spots Do We Have?

Striping of the parking lot is complete. There are twelve handicapped parking spots on the east side of the church and two handicapped parking spots on the north side, in the circle drive. The size of our parking lot requires us to have six spots.

What Do These Signs Mean?

You will soon see these signs posted on the north side of the building.

Between the signs: On Sunday mornings and during Special Events, the six spots between the signs are handicapped parking. At all other times, these spots are flex parking spots; meaning anyone may park in these spots.

NOT between the signs: These spots are exclusively handicapped parking, as the spots are painted, at all times.

Why do we have flex parking spots?

Safety.

Safety of members and guests. On Sundays and during special events we want to provide ample parking for members and guests with mobility issues. These spots are located on flat areas without curbs or steps.

Safety of preschoolers. These spots are close to the doors. For families dropping off preschoolers, especially on rainy or bitter cold days, it is helpful for the grown up to drive close to the door and drop off the student, without taking siblings out of the vehicle.

Safety of staff. Staff members often work late at night. The flex parking spots allow them to park close to the door.

Council Communications

Monday, June 17, 2024.

Special Guest: Pastor Kristen Nielsen, assistant to the bishop for our Greater Milwaukee Synod, was our invited guest at the meeting. Pastor Nielsen talked about the process St. John's will go through in the next two to three years with Pastor Brian's final year and retirement, seeking an interim who will lead the pastor congregation during our pastoral vacancy, the Mission Exploration Team process, establishing a call committee and then calling a new pastor.

The church council will keep the congregation fully informed during all that is to happen.

Interiors Committee: A preliminary design for a sculpture to hang over the gathering area fireplace was presented on behalf of the Interiors

The council meeting was held on Committee. The sculpture will be paid for by donations from three members of the congregation. No "Pave the Way" funds will be used. Council approved paying the sculptor a deposit for the work. A rendering of the work will be put on display when the final design is available.

> Pastor's Report: Pastor Brian shared some of his experiences from his recent trip to Greece and Turkey. He plans to lead several education sessions sharing these historic places and how they relate to the Bible.

> Pastor Brian is working to put together a stewardship team for the fall.

> Finances: Offerings in May were very strong, but we are still running a deficit for the year. The council will continue to monitor our giving.

July Birthdays

"Pave the Way" Campaign: Work has been done on the circle driveway. Initial sketches for the new interior signage were shared with the council. \$236,000 has been received so far.

Council leaders will meet over the summer with all ministry groups who have displays at church to discuss the current and possible future locations of their displays. Council wants to make sure that all groups have an opportunity to share their thoughts and ideas as we continue our renovation work.


