August marks the last month of the unofficial summer season. Many are taking their vacations before the kids go back to school. Most are enjoying the weather, hopefully by a lake somewhere or at least at a pool. The days are getting shorter and soon we will be in the middle of the fall season.

The fall season in the church has historically started with Rally Day. when the church's programs resume and the rhythm of activity picks up. Rally Day is a day in which we begin to rally our energies toward the upcoming liturgical cycles Advent, of Christmas. Lent. Easter. and Pentecost.

This year our emphasis for the year's programming will center on Stewarding God's Gifts in all aspects of our lives. Often in church, stewardship is something we do in the fall to prepare for next year's budget. We have associated it with the collection of money, and the biblical texts we use in the fall emphasize this.

We want to expand our understanding of stewardship to include God's creation itself and



Summer Handbell Camp 2024

Director Heidi Bischmann and members of the Handbell Choir hosted a Summer Handbell Camp at St. John's the week of July 29. Our quest clinician was Sandra Eithun, a well-known handbell composer and director. Twenty-seven handbell musicians from Wisconsin and Michigan participated in the 4dav workshop focused on handbell technique and musicianship.

The workshop emphasized hands -on learning and group performance. Fourteen pieces – ranging in difficulty from Level 2+ to Level 5 of both sacred and secular music were given to the musicians on Monday morning sight unseen. The schedule included over seven hours per day of mass rehearsals, small group sectionals and individual practice as well as snack breaks, meals and much-needed down time. The week concluded with a public concert given by two mass choirs. It was an enjoyable week of learning new music and techniques in a group setting to improve overall handbell performance.

Creation Corner

Adjust your water softener cycle!

Does your home have a water softener? If your bill comes from the Waukesha Water Utility, you likely no longer need it! If you do use one, be aware that older water softeners regenerate on a timer, flushing unneeded sodium and precious water down the drain on a regular schedule. You may be wasting up to 50 gallons of water each time! Minimize the environmental impact of yours by making sure it has an on-demand setting and have a service technician come out to adjust your unit's settings for the proper level of hardness and efficiency.

On July 23, 2024, we met to assemble the Newborn Kits for Global Health Ministries. This was the 25th year St. John's has donated to this ministry.

The night began with a wonderful fellowship meal. It's always fun to gather & have time to relax & catch up with old friends & meet new friends while sharing a meal together.

After dinner, we assembled 650 Newborn Kits! Over the past 25 years, St. John's has donated a total of 13,717 Newborn Kits!

Newborn Kits

So often, we tell ourselves that we can't make a huge difference. This is a perfect example of making a huge impact by working together to improve so many lives.

Each kit costs about \$10-\$12, for a total cost of about \$7000, not to mention the time spent to make this happen. Through the generosity of so many people who sew, croquet, knit, shop, wash, cut & trim, fold/count items, donate money, & pray, we are able to help less fortunate mothers receive better medical care as they come to medical facilities to receive these kits. This results in healthier babies being born & provides much needed supplies for the first months of their lives!

This ministry would not be successful without the generous donations of all. As they say, it takes a village, & St. John's has helped to improve the lives of 650 babies & their moms this year!

The meeting was held on Monday, Finances: July 15, 2024.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor Brian shared some of the preliminary plans for the fall stewardship program. The theme will have an emphasis on caring for creation and how we can be better stewards of our property and the ecosystem around our church home.

The stewardship team will look at adding a new outreach ministry without cutting back on our current partnerships.

September will be the fiftieth anniversary of the Lutheran Hunger Appeal.

Council discussed ideas for using a generous special gift to be given by a family at church.

Offerings in July were above the planned level. We are still behind in planned giving for the year, but the last two months have been good ones.

President's Report:

Council will meet with those groups and individuals who have ministry displays in the gathering area to discuss how to improve how they are used.

Property:

Council discussed the proposed buv-out of our current waste collection contract to save us money in the long run. Further steps will be taken to decide the best course of action on this.




