## Pastor Ponders

Here we are at the beginning of September again, and every year we ask ourselves, "Where did the summer go?" Does it seem to you that time moves quickly, especially as you get older? I look at the second hand of the clock and it still moves at the same pace it did when I was younger. Reality and the perception of that reality are often different, and it is often the perception upon which we act. We begin to accept our perceptions as truths, where in fact, the truth may be more complicated or complex than what we ourselves perceive.

Our faith in Christ lies in the perceptions of Christ's disciples who followed him and witnessed his ministry and listened to his teachings. But, they could not perceive the reality of his mission while he was with them. How could they? Up until Easter Sunday, the disciples had never experienced someone rising from the dead and fulfilling God's mission to the world. It has been two thousand years and we still have not directly witnessed such an event. Again, we rely on the perceptions, written down in Scripture, of those who experienced Christ directly.

Perceptions are powerful. We need to ask ourselves, what do people perceive when they walk

through our church doors or when they encounter us in the communities in which we live and work?

As we begin another ministry program year, I believe people will perceive us as committed stewards of all God's gifts and resources that have been entrusted to us. They will perceive a congregation that is committed to ending hunger around the world, as we celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of ELCA World Hunger that we will lift up in September. They will perceive our commitment to the stewardship of God's creation in our book study and worship in October and November. They will perceive our commitment to the stewardship of God's gift to us in community, as we care for our own and other faith communities and their ministries. Finally, they will perceive our commitment to the stewardship of our personal faith lives as we enter into the spiritual disciplines in the Lenten season during the spiring.

Perception is a powerful thing. Let us perceive, reflect upon, and witness the underlying reality that is truly God's gift in the world today – our Savior and Risen Lord, Jesus Christ.



## Our New Gathering Space

For over four years, the Interiors Team has been an active part of the ministries at St. John's. Our efforts are supported by Pastor, Council, the Property Team, and members who have graciously advised and been a part of our planning and execution efforts for the Pave the Way campaign.

Collectively, Pastor Brian and Groth Design Associates have supported and encouraged our efforts to create an entry space that is more user-friendly and welcoming. An article that they shared with us speaks directly to where we are as a congregation: an aging narthex area that reaches back to the time when our new Centrum was built. Almost twenty-five years later we are reminded of new paradigms that provide creative ways to bring people together.

*"If the collective goal of the church is to make disciples (Matthew 28:19-20), then designing spaces that bring people together becomes a tool for ministry to help accomplish that mission. For instance, when people gather as a corporate body, they form community that reflects the nature of what God intended, and are sent out to reach others, then disciples are made. But first, we need spaces that bring people together. Two ways to design for reaching those outside the church and younger generations would be by creating spaces for short connecting conversations and for longer*

Following the example of our architect, Groth Design Associates, we have created the idea of a coffee station which will have coffee available on a console table under the screen just outside the sanctuary. Fellowship is encouraged by high-top tables, new spaces by the fireplace and window area to facilitate coming together in small groups - to GATHER - to create comfortable user-friendly spaces. This Gathering Space (as we will be calling it) will give us spaces that allow creative interaction. It will define who we are to new people considering a new church home: a place where we can interact that is brighter, lighter and more welcoming than our former coffee area in the dark Fellowship Hall.

We look forward to the excitement of seeing the new furnishings, fireplace, artwork and coffee station in September. Come and get excited about your new GATHERING SPACE. Matthew's gospel says it so well: "Go, then, to people everywhere and make them my disciples." We were given a commission. Let's join in Christ's commission and reach out. WELCOME should be written all over our faces and the new fresh image that we present to people we hope to bring into our community.

**"Stewardship: Care of God's Creation"** is our theme for Adult Ministry this Fall. We will be using Sandra L. Richter's book "Stewards of Eden – What Scripture Says About the Environment and Why It Matters". Richter knows the Bible and is an expert on ancient Israeli culture.


She starts out with the creation story where God commands us to be good stewards of His very good creation. "If you love what God loves, you are probably going to wind up caring about it."

She follows with examples of ancient Israeli practices, commanded by Old Testament law, that can serve as models for us today, practices that promote sustainability regarding our care of the land and animals.

Each chapter finishes with an eye-opening case study of some of the poor practices followed today. A summary may be "The earth is the Lord's and all it contains. You may use it in your need. But you shall

not abuse it with your greed." The program will start the first week in October.

Books will be available through the small group facilitators. For those not part of one of the groups, we will have a few books available in the church lobby for a donation of \$15, or you can purchase a book directly through your normal book buying process.



As you may have noticed, we have finished paving the circle drive and have replaced the outdoor lighting with new ones that are more effective and which we now own. We have also purchased new furniture and artwork for the Narthex, and we have donated the first installment of our pledge to the Hope Center, of which we have committed 10% of our total amount pledged and received.

# Council Communications

## St. John's Lutheran Church Council Report

The meeting was held on Monday, August 19, 2024.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Brian shared his thoughts on the fall stewardship program, emphasizing caring for creation, which includes plans for using "green space" and energy efficiency in St. John's future.

**Finances:** Offerings in July were under budget, this after strong offerings in May and June. We are currently about 11% under planned income for the year which is not unusual for this time of the year.

**President's Report:** The council discussed plans to have the Interiors Committee meet with the church staff and groups with

ministry displays in the Gathering Space in order to better communicate plans and ideas for using the space.

**Property Committee:** The time and effort donated by our many talented volunteers was held up, work which saves the church a great deal of money.

Council discussed up-coming property expenses which include a needed update of our security camera system at church.

**"Pave the Way" Campaign:** About \$1,000 was contributed during July. Council discussed a letter to the congregation updating where we stand financially with the campaign.

The circular drive work has been completed and the company paid for the work. Several other planned expenses will be paid in the next month.

**New Business:** Curtis Templin was appointed to serve a three-year term on the Endowment Committee.
