

Pastor Ponders

"lf then there any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your interests, but to the interests of others. Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus. " (Philippians 2:1-5)

This passage from Paul's letter lifts up the virtue of humility. Humility is a difficult thing, though, and true humility, the way Paul describes it, is almost impossible. Even when we believe that we are doing often a selfish or self-serving that we cannot be of one mind if hidden motive behind it. Our egos may want a little recognition for the seeing the true mind of Christ. good we are doing for others. Or Sadly, we may think that we are right and know better than others about caught what is right, and do not consider the thoughts, feelings, experiences of others. Selfrighteousness can hide itself in our believing that we are doing God's something that in is righteousness.

What Paul is calling congregation to do is to have the courage and honesty to look within themselves to see where there own sin lies. As Jesus said, "why do you see the speck in someone's eye when you don't see the log in

things for others, there is most your own". Paul knows very well our own egos stand in the way of many congregations Paul's time and in our own are in what seems perpetual conflict.

> The question is not whether we can avoid conflict, but rather, how do we move through the conflict to come together for the sake of the gospel. This is the question that Paul tries to answer, not only to the his Philippians, but to all the churches with whom he is in contact.

Science Friday in Preschool

Mrs. DeCoto's Science Friday experiments introduce Preschoolers to science and help them learn new, exciting things in a fun and hands-on way.

This Friday's lesson was Absorption and Dissolving. How do you teach that to curious Three Year Olds? With a Sugar Cube Experiment.

First, we learned what a sugar cube is (they'd never seen one!) counting to eight three times (never pass up an opportunity to count aloud), and why and how to color the water green, blue and red (next to Rainbow, these are our favorite colors).

Then the Science questions and answers began right before their eyes. When we saw the sugar cubes melting, we asked if green melted faster than blue or red. No, color doesn't matter. If not color, what is making them melt? Water. Does melting happen right away? It colors the sugar cube and then melted very quickly! Can you stop the melting? No.

And there you, too, have learned about Absorption and Dissolving.



There was also a lot of singing, praying and happiness at being together, sharing of food and much prayer. The actual buildings are a testament to the partnership but also the scholarship students


Serving the World

Council Communications

The meeting was held on Monday, total income of around \$711,000. January 20, 2025. Having made reductions in many

Pastor's Report: Pastor Brian said that the Christmas Eve worship services were well attended and well received by those at worship.

Finances: The congregation ended 2024 with offerings about \$100,000 less than anticipated. However, due to the diligent work of our church staff, expenses were \$50,000 less than budgeted so we ended the year with about a \$50,000 deficit. This will be covered by congregational cash reserves.

The Finance Committee worked long and hard to prepare a budget for 2025 which reflects a more realistic income number. We have received about 110 pledges for a total of \$575,000 in pledged giving for 2025. We anticipate

total income of around \$711,000. Having made reductions in many areas and taking money from designated funds to cover some ministry needs, the council approved a budget of \$727,000 which includes a planned \$16,600 deficit. This budget will be presented to the congregation at the February 2 annual meeting.

Carrie Peters, council treasurer, presented plans to create a permanent stewardship committee which will begin work to look at ways of increasing giving, dealing with our congregational financial needs and planning for the Fall 2025 stewardship program. The council approved the creation of this committee.

Property Committee: A proposal to spend \$16,000 for needed repairs to the boiler was approved.

The money for this has been designated from the Capital Improvement Fund.

"Pave the Way" Campaign: \$302,000 of the \$312,000 pledged has been received.

The group working on the new outside sign for the church will meet on January 21 to study a proposal from Lemberg Electric for this project.

New Business: Those council members whose terms are ending in June were asked to serve, as is our policy, on the Nominating Committee.
