# Pastor Ponders

It is hard to believe that the Lenten season is upon us!

We observe Lent in remembering the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the desert and enduring temptation by Satan, according to the Gospels, before beginning his public ministry. The English word *Lent* is a shortened form of the Old English word *lencten*, meaning "spring season".

Many still observe the season of Lent by making a sacrifice, a mini attempt at fasting, whereby we may "give-up" something for the forty days. Often, we may try to eat healthier by not eating chocolate or other food items that may have become somewhat addictive. Some go further by trying to quit smoking or drinking

alcohol. In the Roman Catholic tradition, there was a prohibition of eating meat on Fridays – whence the tradition of fish fries on Fridays. Whatever the sacrifice, the point is to feel the power of those temptations and the will power needed to overcome them. It is faith strengthened through subtraction, if you will.

There is also a way in which faith is strengthened through addition. We can add more prayer in our daily lives or even begin devoting more time in meditation or Scripture reading. A new Lenten practice may be to start a new small group that shares common interests or commitments. Also, the church offers Wednesday Lenten services and meals for

those who are strengthened through rituals.

However we may add or subtract from our normal daily routines, these efforts are made to be more conscious of our relationship with God. As Jesus depended on the strength of God throughout his public ministry, we too are totally reliant on God and God's grace to see us through whatever sacrifices we make or the abundances we receive. Life has a way of giving us both. In this Lenten season, let us remember and live out the gospel of Jesus Christ, whose own sacrifice has been to the glory of God!

The February service project led by the youth was letter writing. The letters were shared with our shut ins and with our young adults. It is good for us to stay connected as a community of faith!






# Meet the Human Resources Committee





# Council Communications

The meeting was held on Monday, February 17, 2025.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Brian was ill and could not attend the meeting.

**Finances:** A review of the budget, which was approved at the February 2 congregational meeting, was shared by treasurer Carrie Peters.

January offerings were 44% over the budgeted amount. Part of this was due to a large offering gift which is given every other year. The amounts budgeted each month for benevolences were not paid in January because they had not yet been approved at the congregational meeting. Double payments will be made in February. Expenses were 22% under budget in January, in part to this.

An update was given about the newly formed Stewardship Committee and a recommendation from the Finance Committee concerning sound policies for handling cash.

**President's Report:** Paul Bulgerin is going to meet with Pastor Kristin Nielsen, assistant to the bishop, on February 27 to discuss plans for Pastor Brian's retirement and our up-coming pastoral transition. Pastor Nielsen was invited to attend the March council meeting to share this information with the council.

**"Pave the Way" Campaign:** Council received updates on plans for both the outside signage and the new signs which will help direct people inside the church building.

An update was shared on tithes being given through "Pave the Way" to the Hope Center and the council discussed preliminary plans on what to do with any remaining funds once "Pave the Way" is completed.

**Nominating Committee:** The members of the committee, who were elected at the February 2 congregational meeting, are Pastor Brian, Paul Bulgerin, Carrie Peters, Keith Paukner, James

Morgan and Josh Werner. They will seek nominees for three positions on the church council and two on the Endowment Committee. The Nominating Committee met for the first time following the council meeting.

**Endowment Committee:** The members of the committee were pleased to be able to recommend eighteen different projects, totaling \$20,050, to the council. These were all approved. Endowment will seek direction from the Finance Committee since \$9,000-15,000 more is available to help ministries and programs in 2025.
