

We will be using Hal Hopson's setting of Tenebrae on Good Friday at 6:30 p.m.

Hopson's service of Tenebrae follows a tradition of the early church dating back to the eighth century, and commemorates the final hours of Christ's life on earth as He prepared for and suffered death on the cross.

### What Wondrous Love Is This

A hymn note about a beloved Lenten hymn tune: *What Wondrous Love Is This* (American Folk Hymn; Source: Southern Harmony 1835, Evangelical Lutheran Hymnal #666)

The melody for this hymn shows signs of Celtic influences, and the unusual meter is that of an old sea chanty about Captain Kidd. The tune first appeared in the valleys of the Southern Appalachians, where William Walker recorded it and included it in his historic Southern Harmony. Each stanza has a single thought which is underscored by repetition, but it is the haunting melody that has made this hymn so popular in this country. (Hymn note by Austin Lovelace)



# Stewardship Update



# **Council Communications**

Council Highlights for March 17 Meeting

- Pr. Kristen Nielsen, from the synod office, assistant to the Bishop, visited with us and outlined what we need to do over the last months of Pastor Brian's ministry and then into the weeks after his retirement.
- Pastor Brian highlighted the coming Adult Education Forums for April 6 and 13<sup>.</sup>
- The financial report highlights: Very good month of February, giving was 12% over budget and expenses were 7% under budget. We are hoping that will

continue into March. The council voted to move \$5,000 to the Capital Improvement Fund since we were carrying over 45 days of cash on hand. Carrie Peters and Paul Bulgerin will meet with the staff to discuss the new cash handling policy.

- President's Report: There is secretive work being done on Pastor Brian's farewell celebration on May 25. The council will serve the Lenten meal on April 9.
- Property Committee: The boiler's electronic controls will be upgraded and changed the week of May 26.
- Pave the Way updates: The Sign committee made a recommendation to the council to pursue the electronic sign which is the primary choice for replacing the old sign, even though there are many hurdles to work through to get that done. There are indications that the Town of Brookfield may be willing to make some allowances. The Interior signage is scheduled to be put up in April.
- Nominating committee has been working on filling the vacancies for the church council and endowment committee.
