



At our June Annual Meeting, we introduced our new Youth **Endowment Fund!**

St. John's has a very exciting opportunity to create a legacy gift to the Children, Youth, and Family program through an incredibly generous \$15,000 financial gift designed to match all gifts towards the fund. Similar in structure to St. John's current Endowment fund, the Youth Endowment fund would use a portion of annual returns to provide children and youth of the congregation with educational scholarships, scholarships for church sponsored activities and/or trips, and to provide additional funding for special CYF programs or events. The fund is not intended to be used for funding normal

planning, in the event of budget Ways to donate deficits or for regular budget items.

The initial \$15,000 gift is intended as а matching gift, so as congregation members donate to the fund, their gift will be doubled! Funds will be deposited in the ELCA Ministry Growth Fund and the Children, Youth, and Family Board will oversee the Youth Endowment Fund.



If you stop by St. John's the week of July 28, you are sure to experience a unique and fun event – Summer Handbell Camp 2025. Director Heidi Bischmann and members of our handbell choir will participate in this exciting, educational event. A total group size of 32-37 people is anticipated to fill positions in two or more handbell choirs. Participants are from various churches, schools and community handbell choirs from around the state of Wisconsin and Michigan.

Summer Handbell Camp is a four-day intensive workshop focused on handbell technique and musicianship. Daily rehearsals and individual practice emphasize hands-on learning and group performance. Music selections will range in difficulty from Level 2+ to Level 4+ of both sacred and secular music for use throughout the year. Well known composer and clinician Sandra Eithun will direct the mass choirs in a fast-paced group setting to make this workshop enjoyable for musicians interested in improving their handbell performance.

There will be a free concert on Thursday, July 31 at 7:00 pm in the sanctuary featuring the 14 handbell selections from the workshop with guest instrumentalists on piano, flute and percussion.


We have completed Phase 1 of our boiler system upgrade. Brian, Dave and Ken worked with Dillett Mechanical to make sure the process went smoothly.

Council Communications

Church Council Meeting Update for June 2025

The church council met on Monday, June 16. We welcomed our new council members. Patrice Krimpelbein, Gregg Everts and Pauline Shoemaker.

Finances: Offerings for May were 29% less than budgeted. This was the first month of the year where offerings were under the budgeted amount. Expenses were also under budget for the month. So far for 2025 our offerings are 8% over the budgeted amount.

We discussed the process for setting salary and benefits for the interim pastor. These may exceed what we have budgeted for the vear since the Finance Committee budgeted for an interim pastor with fifteen years of experience and all the candidates we have received have more experience than that.

received the names of three pastors who are interested in serving as our interim pastor. The synod office told us it is unusual to have so many pastors interested in serving as an interim at one congregation.

A group of council members, along with a member of the Human Resources Committee, will serve as the interview group to meet with the candidates. We hope to meet with all three during the week of June 22 so that we can keep the process going in a timely fashion.

I also shared a brief summary of the Greater Milwaukee Synod Assembly which as held on May 30-31. I served as St. John's voting member at the assembly.

Interim Pastor Search: We have Property Committee: The council examined and approved the estimate to do the needed HVAC work at church. The money for this was previously set aside and will not affect the church budget.

> "Pave The Way Campaign": The Town of Brookfield is holding a meeting on June 24 to discuss changing its ordinance so that it allow would institutional organizations to have electronic outdoor signs. Funds for this, if approved by the Town, are part of the money given to the "Pave the Way Campaign".
