#### PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Our Confirmation program at St. John's begins with a 2-year Bible Overview Class in 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Formal Confirmation Classes with Pastor Karen begin in 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade.

In 9<sup>th</sup> grade, students put their faith into action with monthly gatherings exploring world religions as well as visiting those Houses of Worship, participation in High School Youth Group, and a Lutherdale Retreat, and then are Confirmed in May. We encourage families to participate in worship on a regular basis.

Students LOVE this time. It is relaxed and they complete lots of different service projects. Students can drop in as they are able. The first day of YLT is Sept. 7<sup>th</sup>.

#### 10:45am Contemporary Worship

This is a family-oriented worship experience with a Children's message, family blessing time, and shortened liturgy. It is our contemporary service with the band.

<u>Serving in Worship</u> - We would like our Middle Schoolers to serve as worship leaders as they are comfortable. This includes reading the lesson, reading the prayers, serving communion, acolyting, and ushering. Pastor Karen will be leading training on these activities.

#### **Behavioral Expectations**
