# Pastor Ponders: What Are You Waiting For?

**Advent is a Season for Waiting.** Isaiah promises: *“They that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; (Isa. 40:31). St. John’s is in an interim period, a transition in pastoral leadership. We are waiting upon the MET process of helping St. John’s discern where God might be calling this congregation. How about you? Are you waiting for something - to get better, someone to arrive, to reach a finish line? Patience and curiosity are very helpful when waiting. So is hope.*

Arthur Brooks, in his book, “Build the Life You Want” makes a distinction between optimism and hope. He says optimism is the belief that things will turn out all right (pessimism is that it won’t); hope makes no such assumption but is a conviction that one can act to make things better in some way. Whether you are optimistic or pessimistic you can still have hope; or believe you can do something.

**Advent is a Season for Welcoming Something New.** Isaiah 43:18-19 speaks the Word of God: *“Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?”*

This month, St. John’s is trying something new, an Advent Fest.

It’s a celebration of getting ready. It’s a new way for gathering together as a community and guests to eat, worship, and serve. During an interim period it’s through experimenting, trying new things, that we can learn and grow ministry. How about you? Are you willing to try something new to help your situation, broaden your experiences, assist someone else, connect with others?

**Advent is a season for Joyful Surprises.** Mary declares: *‘My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. - Luke 1:47-48*

This month, we celebrate the joy of Christmas on Music Sunday, December 14. We’ll gather as one community, one worship, united in singing, with the many talented musicians to lead us. Bring a friend and share our joy. We know what it is to wait, to endure suffering, grief, the shadows in the human heart, the silence of God. We trust in God, who has led us this far. How can we keep from singing? How about you? What joyful surprises are you anticipating?

This "Casa Maya" or greenhouse holds 400 green pepper plants which will produce a huge harvest to sell at a good price which allows families to earn a living and the community to purchase food at a price they can afford. 

## Council Communications

The meeting was held on Monday, November 17, 2025

**Finances:** Offerings for October were strong, coming in at 15% over budget. Year-to-date offerings are 6% over the budgeted amount.

Expenses for the month were 4% over budget due to the extra expenses related to the mold abatement work done in the sanctuary.

The Finance Committee is working on the proposed 2026 church budget and will share that proposal with the council in December.

**Pastor's Report:** The Mission Exploration Team (MET) is conducting the congregational survey. They hope to get 50% of St. John's members to complete it by November 23. Their next meeting will be on December 9.

The Adult Ministry Team is looking for themes for the 2026 St. John's Academy presentations.

Pastor Karen is attending the annual Hope Center fundraiser on November 20. Ralph Zick will be honored at this event for his many years of dedicated service to the Hope Center.

**President's Report:** Paul Bulgerin and Brittany Larson will meet with Heidi Bischmann to discuss updating the church's Facility Use document.

A copy of our St. John's constitution, which has been in a state of "limbo" since 2020, was submitted to the synod secretary, Pastor Sarah Stobie, for her to see what needs to be done to bring it into conformity with the ELCA model constitution, which was adopted in August 2025.

**Property Committee:** A proposal was presented and approved to spend \$9,600 from the Capital Improvement Fund in 2026 to convert the sanctuary lighting from halogen lamps to LED. An additional \$1,500 was designated to purchase replacement LED fixtures for future use. This conversion will result in an annual energy savings of \$2,100. The congregation should recoup this expenditure in about three and a half years.

Mark Latus and Brian Zach will attend the Town of Brookfield meeting on November 20 to discuss the proposed work to be done on Davidson Road.

**Old Business:** The council discussed and approved a request by Scout Troop 4 to begin a charter relationship with St. John's.

### Use Recyclable Wrapping Paper

Americans throw away 25% more trash during the Thanksgiving to New Year's holiday period than any other time of year. The extra waste amounts to 25 million tons of garbage, or about 1 million extra tons per week!

Reduce your impact by considering how you wrap your gifts. A general rule of thumb is that regular wrapping paper (including the glossy stuff) is often recyclable as long as it doesn't have non-paper
