




### Not Too Late for Youth Quake!


## Creation Corner

### Limit your use of Outdoor Salt

In WI, road salt is synonymous with winter. But did you know? Road salts are toxic to children, pets, birds and wildlife. They can damage vegetation and destroy the organisms in soil. And just one teaspoon of salt can permanently pollute five gallons of water!

Limit your use of road salt around your home and business. Try a natural alternatives and avoid oversalting. Identify the critical areas where ice builds up and then shovel often and early.



# Council Communications

The meeting was held on Monday, December 15, 2025.

**Finances:** Offerings for November were 7% under the budgeted amount. Part of this was due to having to cancel worship services on the last Sunday in November due to the snowstorm. Year-to-date offerings are 5% over the budgeted amount, a continuing positive trend.

Expenses for the month were 4% over budget.

The Finance Committee's proposed 2026 church budget was discussed. Finance will present the final version of the proposed 2026 budget, along with a report on 2025 giving, to the council for approval at its January meeting.

Listening sessions where the proposed budget will be shared with members will be held on January 22 and January 25. The annual congregational budget meeting will be held on Sunday, February 1.

**Pastor's Report:** The Mission Exploration Team (MET) has received over 100 survey reports from members. They are meeting on Wednesday, December 17 and are going to set up a series of small group meetings with members to discuss the results of the congregational survey.

Pastor Karen is planning to hold a mini-retreat with the members of the church council and paid staff to discuss the MET surveys, the roles of these groups and the pastor and how to improve how

they work together. The retreat will also be an opportunity to look ahead to 2026.

The preschool has qualified for a two-year grant from the State of Wisconsin called "Get Kids Ready".

**President's Report:** Paul Bulgerin and Brittany Larson met with Heidi Bischmann to discuss updating the church's Facility Use document. Heidi is sharing the results of this meeting with the church staff and will present a draft of the document to the council for approval in January.

**Property Committee:** Mark Latus filled the council in on the roof leak in the Gathering Space following the heavy snow on November 30 and the work that will be needed to repair it.

**"Pave the Way" (PTW) Campaign:** Design work continues on the outdoor church sign. The cost of this is fully funded from PTW. A \$15,000 deposit for the sign has already been paid. This was done in order to "lock in" the final price.

Interiors is meeting with a designer to discuss replacing the brown chairs in the Gathering Space. Some of these are ripped.

About \$113,700 remains unspent from PTW. The sign will take about \$45-50,000 of this amount. The church council will develop a plan, to present to the congregation, on what to do with any unspent funds. The big reason why we will have unspent funds is due to the much lower than anticipated cost of work on the circular drive.

**New Business:** Church bookkeeper Rebecca Mitchell has submitted her resignation effective January 7, 2026. The council thanks her for her excellent work these past years. The Human Resources Committee met on December 10 to discuss plans to advertise and recruit for a new bookkeeper.
