LENT

This month, our Lenten journey begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18. Our focus will be on “Hearing God” or developing a conversational relationship with God. Dallas Willard, in his book from whom this title is borrowed, says: *God has created us for an intimate friendship - both now and forever. In our ongoing friendship we tell God what is on our hearts in prayer and learn to perceive what God is saying to us. How can you be sure God is speaking to you? We learn by experience.*

As part of this Lenten journey you are invited to a weekly Wednesday evening meal, fellowship and worship. The worship will follow the stories of five biblical characters. Each was unique in how they heard or responded to God. This time of worship is for you to be with God and the people of God, to affirm God is with us. God delights in your thanks and praise.

This month, the Mission Exploration Team (MET)

continues to host small groups to engage you in the discernment of St. John’s future. MET is also trying to hear God. They want to specifically hear God’s guidance through your conversations. Keep praying for MET and for St. John’s and the next pastor you seek to serve among you.

We’ll be learning about the specific roles that staff, pastor, and council serve in leading a congregation. We want to affirm how we best work together. And I keep praying for you, that you will continue to lean on God’s goodness and grace. Draw near to God and God will draw near to you.

The state is making preschool free for 4K families and pays us for the time children are attending our Get Kids Ready 4K class.

What will change? We'll just be renaming the current Four Year Old class to our 4K Class. Proudly, our current four year old preschool program and Playing to Learn curriculum meets, and exceeds, the criteria for school readiness as required by the state. Many current families have enrolled and there will be some slots open for the community to join St. John's Preschool, too. And we'll continue our Two Year Old and our Three Year Old classes.

And the Preschool Ministry Mission will be the same; to foster learning in a nurturing environment in which our young children are loved, respected, and valued.

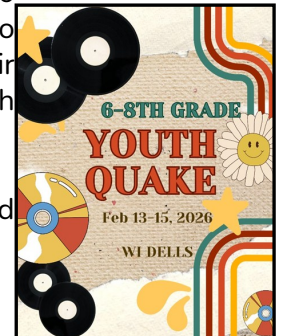

Giving Tree Thank You

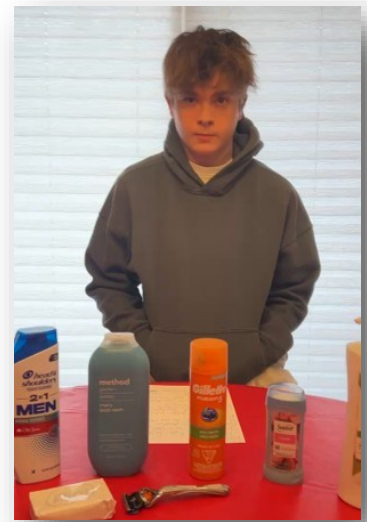

Council Communications

The meeting was held on Monday, January 19, 2026. Because of the cold weather, it was held as a ZOOM meeting.

Outdoor Sign: Brian Zach presented the design for the proposed electronic outside sign. Council approved. The sign, which has been reviewed by staff at the Town of Brookfield, will next need the Town's final approval.

MET Update: Shelley Saeger, a member of the Mission Exploration Team, gave the council an update on the congregational survey findings and plans for the small group meetings in January and February.

Finances: The congregation ended 2025 in good financial shape. Total giving was \$743,718 which was 104% of projected income. Expenses were \$705,806 which was 96% of projected spending. St. John's received \$37,912 more than it spent in 2025. Thank You to all our generous givers!

The council discussed and approved the proposed 2026

budget prepared by the Finance Team. The budget anticipates \$748,229 in income with total expenses of \$770,772. The Finance Team feels comfortable with this deficit budget. The proposed budget will be voted on by the congregation at the February 1 meeting.

Pastor's Report: Details were shared about the February 7 mini-retreat with church staff and the members of the church council.

Our new bookkeeper, Dorothee Chen, has been hired and has begun her work.

Pastor congratulated Stephanie and Corey Broussard on the birth of their daughter Nellie.

President's Report: Plans for the February 1 annual meeting were shared.

At the February 1 congregational meeting we will select the Nominating Committee to fill the council positions for president, secretary and two at-large seats.

Our St. John's Constitution, which has been in "revision limbo" since 2019, has been updated by Pastor Sarah Stobie, the secretary

of the Greater Milwaukee Synod. This version, which brings our constitution into agreement with the ELCA model constitution for congregations, will be reviewed and then presented to the congregation for approval, perhaps at the June annual meeting.

Property Committee: The leaky roof by the gathering space stairs will need to be repaired when warmer weather arrives.

"Pave the Way" (PTW) Campaign: When the work for the campaign concludes, we will have unspent funds since the costs of the projects were less than the money raised. The Finance Committee recommends that these unspent funds be put into the Capital Improvement Fund to help with future building needs.
