Pastor Ponderings—A New Commitment

He is risen. He is risen indeed! This month we come again to our Easter celebration. We express our gratitude for Christ's sacrifice on the cross and our joy for Christ's victory over death and the glorious new beginnings it gives.

We also celebrate what his resurrection gives. For by his cross, he has redeemed the world. In our worship this month we're going to hear stories of how this event gave Jesus' followers a new perspective. One story tells how they were hiding behind closed doors in fear of the authorities. The resurrected Jesus shows up to give them hope, faith and courage to open their door and make a new commitment as followers. What door are you waiting to open, needing this kind of nudge?

At St. John's, a new door is opening this month in the Call Process. The Mission Exploration Team has completed the MSP or Ministry Site Profile and is ready to hand it off to a new team of volunteers, the Call Committee. (Think of it this way: MET wrote the job description for St. John's next pastor and the Call Committee conducts the interviews).

Another story we'll hear in worship is how Jesus helps some followers on the road to Emmaus re-interpret the events of his life and death. He helps

them see God's greater purpose for the sake of the world. It gave them a new commitment to continue as Jesus' disciples. What re-interpretation are you needing to understand the events in your life so that you can keep going?

At St. John's, the Call Committee and the candidates they interview need your commitment to pray for them. And, they need your commitment to be patient in waiting as they maintain the privacy for these pastors and the congregations they may currently be serving.

Another important commitment is continuing to imagine the next season of the life of this congregation. The MET process discerned from you a readiness for change. What that might be is yet unclear. What changes might occur during this interim period that are worthy of our consideration?

I'm praying for you - for the doors you're waiting to open in your life; for the doors this congregation is wanting to open for the next season of your ministry.

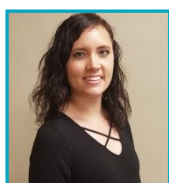

Invite family, friends, and neighbors to hear this important presentation.

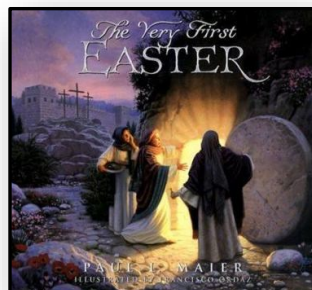

April Focus is Newborn Kits

Newborn Kits are our outreach focus from April. We have a partnership with Global Health Ministries, who ships the completed kits to various developing countries in Africa, Asia, and Central America.

The kits are used as incentive to get expectant moms to come into the clinics and hospitals. In the countries Global Health Ministries partners with, both birth and maternity mortality rates have decreased tremendously!

So how do we contribute to this mission? Throughout the year, St. John's members and some friends in the community donate items for the Newborn Kits. Every kits includes a onesie, receiving blanket, baby hat, bar of Ivory soap, towel, washcloth, diapers, and diaper pins.

Our goal remains at 600 kits for 2026. As of today, we needs lots of blankets, onesies, Ivory soap, and hats, as well as about \$3000 in monetary donations.

Donated items may be placed in the shopping cart during the month of April. After that, items may be placed in the blue donation bin in the Fellowship Hall.

Council Communications

The meeting was held on Monday, March 16, 2026. Because of the blizzard a ZOOM meeting was held.

Minutes: The minutes from the February meeting were approved.

Finances: Offerings for February were 22% less than the budgeted amount. This is because in 2025 we received one large full year offering in February which we did not receive this year. Weekly offerings were as expected. The 2026 budget is designed to account for this.

The Finance Committee recommended not moving any funds into the capital improvement fund this month.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Karen gave an update on the work of the Mission Exploration Team. The team is finishing up the Mission Site Profile and will present it to the council at a special meeting on March 30. There will be a congregational "Town Hall" meeting after the 9:00 a.m. worship service on Sunday, April 12. Bishop Paul Erickson and Pastor Kristen Nielsen will be at St. John's that

day to conduct the meeting, receive the Mission Site Profile and inform the congregation on the work of the call committee.

We are currently seeking nominations for those who will serve on the Call Committee.

The council affirmed the Finance Committee's recommendation to seek a pastor with eleven to twenty years of experience and pay the candidate according to synod guidelines.

There will be one Sunday morning worship service at 9:00 a.m. during the summer months. It will be held inside and have a blend of worship music styles.

President's Report: Updates were given on the work of the Nominating Committee and the group that is updating our congregational constitution.

A session will be held on March 21 to discuss letters on social issues written by the bishops of the national ELCA and our synod, as well as how these pastoral letters tie into ELCA social statements.

Property Committee: Work is being done to clean out the basement boiler room to provide

space for storage for the Scout troop.

The troop will take over the care of the garden on church property.

Work continues to replace the LED lights in the sanctuary.

"Pave the Way" (PTW) Campaign: The Town of Brookfield is holding a meeting on April 18 as part of the continuing discussions on signage in the village and at church.

A deposit has been paid for the new chairs in the gathering space.

Old Business: The proposal for updating the church building usage policy, which was tabled at the February meeting, was discussed and approved.

Council gave permission for the Scouts to hold annual winter and spring fund raising events at church.
