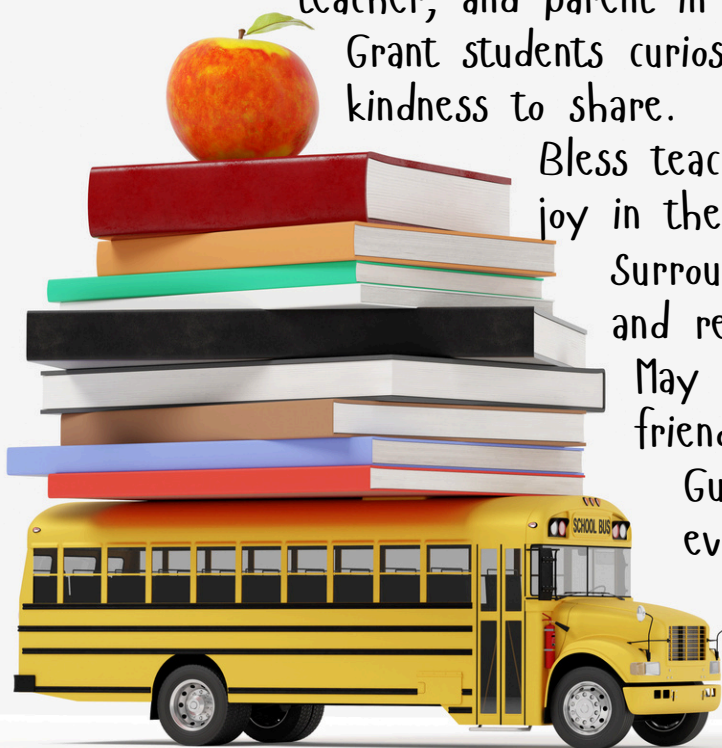

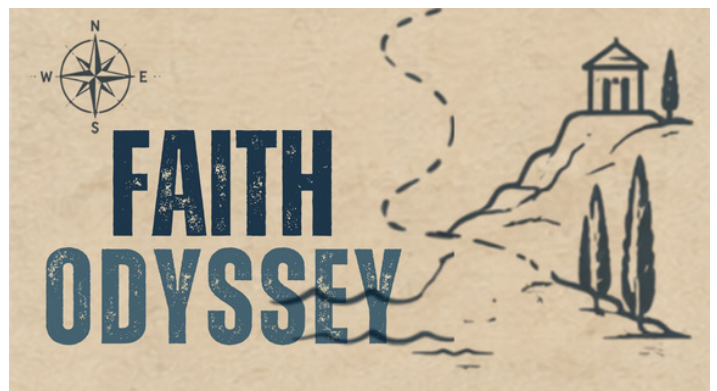

Music Notes

Summer Handbell Camp

Director Heidi Bischmann and members of the St. John's Handbell Choir hosted the third annual Summer Handbell Camp at St. John's the week of July 27. Our guest clinician was Sandra Eithun, a nationally recognized handbell composer, arranger, and director. Thirty-one handbell musicians from Wisconsin and Michigan participated in the four-day workshop, which focused on handbell technique, musicianship, and ensemble performance.

The workshop emphasized hands-on learning and the joy of making music together. Twelve pieces—ranging in difficulty from Level 2+ to Level 4+ and representing both sacred and secular music—were handed out Monday morning, sight unseen. Each day included more than seven hours of mass rehearsals, small-group sectionals, and individual practice, along with snack breaks, meals, and some much-needed downtime.



The week culminated in a well-attended public concert featuring three massed handbell choirs. It was a rewarding and enjoyable week filled with new music, new techniques, and the opportunity to grow as handbell musicians in a supportive group setting.

A heartfelt thank-you to the staff and members of St. John's for their help, hospitality, and support in making this unique and special event possible!

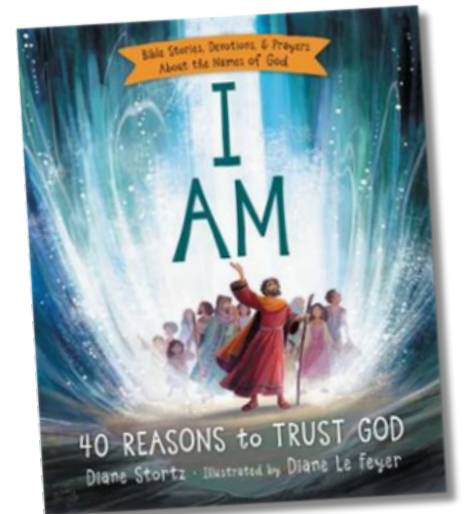

Council Communications

Greetings to St. John's Members,

The Council met Monday,
August 17, 2026.

At its August 17 meeting, the Church Council opened with devotion and prayer and approved the July meeting minutes and financial report. July giving and income were above budget for the month. Year-to-date income remained slightly below budget, while expenses remained below budget. Council also began preparing for the 2027 budget and discussing longer-term facility planning. Carrie Peters and Lisa Belli-Fuchs continue serving as Co-Treasurers during this transition.

Council approved the PACT transition-support proposal and received an encouraging update from the Call Committee, which is preparing for two second-round candidate interviews. A special congregation meeting to approve the updated Constitution will be scheduled in September.

We celebrated the Pave the Way sign project's approval following the zoning process. Council discussed ways to recognize the many people who helped move the project forward when the sign is installed.

The Summer Worship Service Survey was approved, subject to the wording revision discussed at the meeting. The plan is to have two weeks following Rally Day on September 13, for congregation members to share feedback about the temporary summer worship schedule, worship style and timing, volunteer participation, and future worship planning.

Council also received a positive preschool update. Enrollment was reported at 23 students, and a new platform is supporting financial management with potential ability to communicate with families.

Work continues on the church organizational chart. It remains a working document intended to clarify leadership, ministry coordination, accountability, and communication throughout St. John's.

The next Council meeting will be Monday, September 21, at 6:30 p.m.
